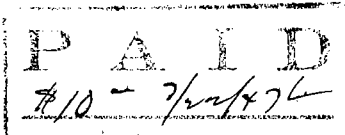

This suspension is effective as of December 31, 1948. The sending of this notice has been delayed with the earnest wish that you might take some action in the matter.


