The undersigned was privileged to be one of those to sign the Fellowship nomination of Mr. Bradley P. Kidder, A.I.A.



Gentlemen:


The Western Mountain District of the A.I.A. has made rapid progress under his directorship. He is now serving his third year in this capacity.


It is with great pleasure and enthusiasm that the Executive Committee of the Colorado Chapter support the nomination for Fellowship of Bradley P. Kidder.



The Rio Grande Symphony is a non-profit musical organization formed some three and a half years ago to fill the need for a planned program of orchestral music in Santa Fe. At its inception, it was composed of eight string players and in the brief span of its existence the playing membership has increased to fifty-seven, encompassing the full orchestral complement of instruments. We now have a paid orchestral director and offer four regular concerts each season, some with nationally recognized soloists.

As Vice President of the Board of Directors of the Rio Grande Symphony, Mr. Bradley P. Kidder has brought sound thinking and careful planning to the affairs of the organization. As a cultural activity for Santa Fe and surrounding communities, we feel that Mr. Kidder has aided immeasurably in broadening the scope of an important phase of the local musical arts program.

The Board of Directors feels that Mr. Kidder has made positive contributions to community life through the medium of symphonic music. It is with great pride that this Board endorses his election to Fellowship in the American Institute of Architects as a recognition of his devoted services to this community.

He was Secretary to the New Mexico State Board of Examiners from 1951 to 1953 and Chairman from 1953 to 1957, and acted as advisor to the Governor of the state on many architectural issues; he has worked dilligently with Legislators to formulate and preserve a working statute for practice of architecture; served as regional director for the mountain states area and was the 1959 recipient of the National Kemper Award. Among his many civic activities Mr. Kidder served as District Governor of the Lions Club and served as Vice President for the Rio Grande Symphony Board.

It is difficult to describe on a piece of paper the great public service that Mr. Kidder has achieved, but those who know Brad are very aware of the contributions he has made. I sincerely hope that the jury will confer on Mr. Kidder the honor of Fellow for his leadership and service.
