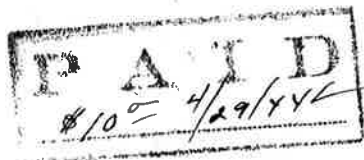

I believe the best answer I can give you in response to your letter of April 20th would be a copy of my letter of April 7th to Senator Cain and his reply of April 18, copies of which are enclosed. (See 154)

Also enclosed is a copy of Mr. Justement's statement on the Housing bill (H.R. 4009) under date of April 14th.

We have since learned that the Senator arbitrarily named every organization that testified before the Joint Committee two years ago (regardless of the nature of their testimony) as members of what he calls a "real estate lobby." This is wholly unfair, in view of the fact that a number of organizations other than our own support public housing.
