Deer Mr. Kolbrook:

The Institute is in receipt of a letter on behalf of the Executive Committee of the Kentucky Chapter, in which it recommends that your membership in the Institute and the Chapter be discontinued for non-payment of Chapter dues.

This action is taken by the Chapter as a matter of policy, and applies to several other members.

As you know, the Institute has carried on its rolls during the depression those members who have been unable to pay dues.

At the last Convention it adopted a plan for adjusting the old accounts, and authorized the Board to reduce the annual dues from \$25 to \$15.

Under that plan your indebtedness to the Institute (not the Chapter) is \$15 for 1935 dues, less a credit of \$5, or \$10.

Your indebtedness to the Kentucky Chapter appears to be \$20.

Under these circumstances, we feel sure that the Treasurer of the Institute will recommend that your Institute account be carried during the remainder of the current year - provided an adjustment of Chapter dues is made with the Kentucky Chapter.

Unless such adjustment is made and the Institute so advised prior to the meeting of its Executive Committee on March 21, it is probable that the recommendation of the Chapter will be acted upon and your membership in the Institute and the Chapter discontinued for non-payment of Chapter dues.

We all hope very much that this will not be the case. The Institute needs the membership and the support of every member of the profession during this critical period.
