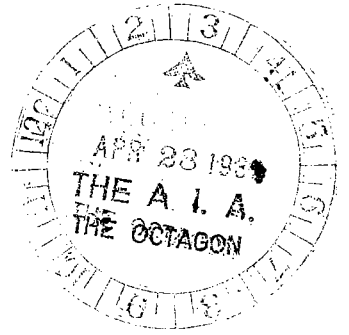

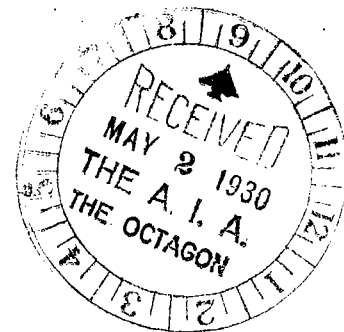



Recently you directed a postal card to Everett V. Welch, Secretary, requesting the correct mailing address of Anton F. Korn.

I regret to state that Mr. Korn passed away about thirty days ago. For your information, Mr. Korn had suffered financial reverses in the last two or three years, and at the time of his death he was employed as an inspector on a defense job near Waco, Texas. He apparently died from a stroke. Mr. Korn was on the suspended list for the past few months because of his inability to pay his dues, and his address was more or less indefinite for sometime past.
