
Gentlemen:

In the years 1946 and 1947, Lewis Koue' regretted the fact that in the Northern California Chapter (San Francisco) there were only a sparse five to eight architects who lived or practiced in the East Bay who were members. The remaining hundred architects in the East Bay refused to go that far away for meetings. He conscientiously felt that the profession would be greatly benefited if more licensed architects were to belong to The American Institute. To this end, for two or three very trying years in which he met wholesome opposition from the Northern California Chapter, he was imbued with the idea that a Chapter in the East Bay would most efficiently serve the profession and The Institute. He worked unstintingly for this cause and finally, upon the granting of a Chapter, he was, in honor of these great efforts, elected its first President in 1948.

It took a great deal of courage, sacrifice and political acumen to accomplish this effort. I personally know all the vicissitudes over which Mr. Koue' triumphed since I had the honor, at the same time, to be a charter member of the Chapter, which has now grown to a membership of over 200.

He has always been a leader in Chapter affairs, has always been of extreme help in the Bylaws Committee, both State and National, and is now most actively engaged in the preservation of State Historic Monuments. For these reasons, I heartily endorse Mr. A. Lewis Koue's nomination to Fellowship.


I have known Mr. A. Lewis Koue for more than 20 years and am well aware of his activities on behalf of the Institute.


