1. This Candidate's service to The Institute has been continual since 1944. In addition toethe fact that he is individually responsible for initiating the chartering of the East Bay Chapter, AIA, he also assisted in the establishing of two other California chapters.

The Northern California chapter, under his chairmanship of the Membership Committee, saw its most marked progress in its representation of the profession. Likewise, his influence in the East Bay Chapter lead it in a pattern of strength which brought it a record for many years as the fastest growing chapter in The Institute.

The programs which he instituted, such as the annual exhibit of East Bay architectural work and the annual joint exhibit of the A.I.A. and the A.L.A. at the California Spring Garden Show, enhanced the status of the profession in the community.

Although his continued devotion to the "Preservation of Historic Buildings" since 1933 is definitely a contribution to the Profession, its scope is of such breadth as to warrant its inclusion in the field of the Candidates' achievement in Public Service.

NOMINEE'S ACHIEVEMENT IN PUBLIC SERVICE

1. List the public offices held by the nominee and the positions of trust held by him in recognition of civic leadership, and state clearly his notable work in public service and the particular influence of that work which the nominators believe to be a notable contribution to the advancement of the profession.

This Candidate has probably been more effective in the field of documenting Historic Buildings and their presembation than any other one on the West Coast of the United States.

Stemming largely from his efforts, the John Muir Home in Contra Costa County is to be preserved as an Historic Monument, and the proposal to establish it as a National Monument is now before Congress.

He was jointly instrumental in influencing the State Division of Highways to revise their route in order to preserve the historic town of Nevada City in the Mother Lode Area of the Sierra foothills.

Also included in their adopted alternate alignment plan was the appropriate landscaping of the abutting highway route to maintain the character of the mining community.

He has and still is exerting his influence to support the presenvation of the Old San Francisco Mint as an Historic Monument.



- 9. By contract with National Park Service, researched and produced historical and architectural descriptive write-ups for Photo-Date Books for nine subjects for Library of Congress.
- By contract, for nominal fee with National Park Service, identified and described on index cards approximately 600 California subjects photographed in the 1930s but never completed for the Library of Congress records.
 (Note: this is part of the 1934 Agreement between the National Park Service, Library of Congress and the AIA, and authorized by the Historic Sites Act of 1935 74th Congress. Program was interrupted by World War II and left in storage.)
- 11. Gave talk, illustrated by slides, covering Sonoma County Frontier 1800-1860 in 1961.
- 12. Gave same talk before two Masonic groups in 1961.
- 13. Gave same talk before Santa Rosa Historical Society in 1962.
- 14. Spoke on historic sites with slides before Lakeshore Garden Club in 1960/
- 15. Appeared before meeting of John Muir Association representing EBAIA and reported on support in behalf of effort to establish the John Muir Home as a National Monument in 1961.
