Dear Mr. Evans:-

It was with regret that the Treasurer had to report to the Officers and Directors of the Institute at their last meeting a large amount still in default covering payment of dues for the current year.

The Directors discussed the matter seriously as the money is needed to meet the balance of our obligations for the year and moreover it seemed to them not quite fair that members who have paid their dues are not only meeting their own obligations but assisting to pay the cash expense necessary to supply the Journal, etc. to those members who have not paid their dues. The Directors passed the following resolution:

RESOLVED, that those members delinquent for more than one year on January 1, 1924, be given until February 1, 1924, to make payment in whole or to reach some agreement with the Treasurer as to future payment. Otherwise the Institute membership of each delinquent coming under this resolution shall be terminated on March 1, 1924, upon notice to him from the Secretary to this effect.

I am sending you this as an appeal to make a remittance to the Treasurer of \$40.00, including the dues for 1923 which, as you know, were payable eleven months ago.

I trust that you will write me promptly and also frankly if for any reason you cannot pay all or any part of the amount at the present moment.

Dear Mr. Evans:

The rush of work following the recent meetings of The Institute and its Board of Directors in Cincinnati has caused this long delay in acknowledging your application for reinstatement to membership in The Institute and its Utah Chapter and your check for \$10.00. Your desire to reaffiliate with The Institute is appreciated by The Board.

The application is in due order except that an additional remittance will be required.

In remitting \$10.00 you probably had in mind the recent reduction in dues for new members. This applies only to new members. Former members seeking reinstatement are required to pay the admission fee of \$5.00 and the regular dues of \$20.00 for one year in advance - total \$25.00.

Also, a former member must pay up any indebtedness to The Institute and to his chapter before consideration can be given the application. The record here shows that at the time you terminated your membership in 1935 you owed Institute dues for -

In reply to your letter of July 15th, 1943, regarding the readmission of Mr. Edward O. Anderson, please be advised that the Executive Committee of the Utah Chapter has waived past chapter dues, which have accrued prior to Mr. Anderson's readmission and recommends that the Institute take the same action in this regard.

Please be advised further that the Executive Committee has taken the same action with respect to Mr. Clifford Evans and strongly recommends that the Institute take similar action.

Dear Mr. Snedaker:

Responding to your letter of September 18th with regard to the recommendation of the Utah Chapter that the delinquent Institute dues of Messrs. Edward O. Anderson and Clifford Evans be remitted:

These matters will be included on the agenda of the next meeting of The Board of Directors which probably will be held early in December - for consideration and action.

Since we wrote to you and to Mr. Anderson on July 15 with regard to the payment made by him when his application for readmission was acted upon, Mr. Anderson responded instructing that the balance of the payment - over and above the amounts of his indebtedness for past dues, admission fee, and first year's dues in advance - be applied or turned over to the War Chest program. That has been done accordingly.

If Mr. Anderson's indebtedness for past dues are remitted by The Board then a refund to him will be involved, unless he instructs that such amount also be turned over to the War Chest Fund.

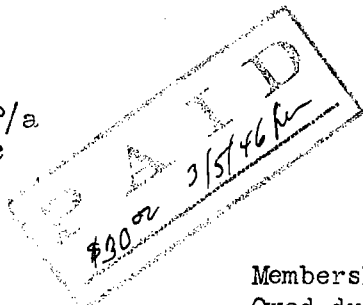

Dear Mr. Evans:

As you know, every corporate member of The Institute must be assigned to a local chapter, and pay dues to that chapter.

When local dues remain unpaid, the chapter may request The Institute to suspend or terminate the membership.

It is a long-established policy of The Board of The Institute to support the chapter in this procedure, but not without making every effort to bring about the restoration of the good standing of the corporate member concerned.

The Utah Chapter, to which you are assigned, has requested that your membership in The Institute and the Chapter be suspended for non-payment of Chapter dues for 1955 and 1956.

The purpose of this letter is to suggest that you clear your account with the Chapter for defaulted dues, thus preserving your corporate membership in good standing.





Dear Mr. Evans:

In accordance with the request of the Utah Chapter that your corporate membership in The American Institute of Architects be suspended for your indebtedness to it for chapter dues, The Board of Directors, as required by the provisions of Chapter I, Article 2, Section 4, paragraph (b-2) of The Institute By-laws, has suspended your membership in The Institute and the Utah Chapter of which you are a member, effective July 1, 1957.

In this connection, your attention is called to the provision of the By-laws of The Institute which reads:

"A corporate member is not in good standing in The Institute or in any of its component organizations if he is under suspension. Immediately upon the suspension of a corporate member, his rights in The Institute and in any of its chapters or state organizations shall be withdrawn until he is restored to good standing."

In addition, The Board of Directors has adopted the following rules with respect to corporate members under suspension:

1. They shall not use the initials "A.I.A."
2. They shall not hold themselves out to the public as members of The Institute.
3. They shall not be classified as members of The Institute by the A.I.A.
4. They shall be removed from the mailing list of The Institute for the period of their suspensions.
5. They will be required to pay dues.
6. They shall not be allowed to attend meetings or participate in any way in Institute activities.

The purpose of The Institute in permitting a membership to be suspended for default of dues rather than terminated forthwith is to enable the member in default to restore his membership within the period of one year from the date of suspension, without paying a readmission fee and without applying therefor. The period of grace in your case terminates on July 1, 1958, unless your indebtedness for chapter dues is taken care of in the interim.
