



JOSE A. FERNANDEZ, a native of Puerto Rico, likes to point out that he is a member of a family of architects, citing besides himself his father, his son and an uncle. After he graduated from Central High School in San Juan, P.R., he came to the mainland United States to continue his education. He studied at Columbia College for two years, then entered the Columbia University School of Architecture on a scholarship. After winning his degree, Mr. Fernández was for nine years an instructor in Columbia's School of Architecture; he has also served as Visiting Critic in Design at both Columbia and the Pratt Institute School of Architecture. Besides practicing his profession with distinction, he has been active in the Architectural League of New York, the American Institute of Architects and the National Institute for Architectural Education; he is also a member of the American Institute of Interior Designers, of the Institute of Architects of Puerto Rico and of the College of Engineers, Architects and Surveyors of Puerto Rico. The recipient of medals and citations from the Instituto de Arquitectos de Puerto Rico and the National College of Architects of Cuba, he was elected 1960 Citizen of the Year for Puerto Rico by the Instituto de Puerto Rico in New York.

Mr. Fernández is the author of a previous book, The Specialty Shop, and of numerous articles in architectural journals here and abroad.
