Apparently Mr. Fink has disregarded the request of this office to discontinue using the letters A. I. A. Inasmuch as he is no longer a member of the Institute, I wonder if he is observing all of the rules of the Registration Board of your state.

Please treat this as a confidential letter and give this office any suggestion that you might have towards putting a stop to a practice which is certainly unfair to the profession, and to the public, in the state of Florida.

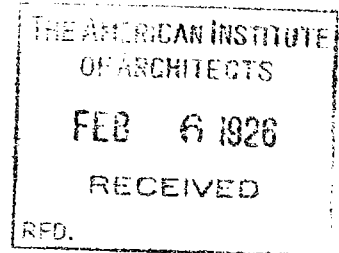

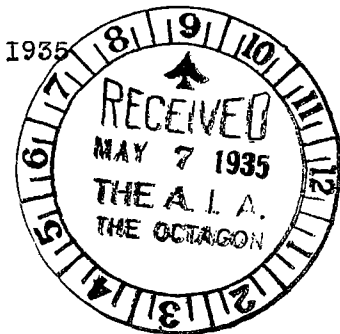

We are in receipt of your letter of May 5th, and are greatly encouraged by your wish to become affiliated, again, with The American Institute of Architects.

According to our records, your membership was discontinued July 1, 1923, at which time you were indebted for dues to the Institute, as follows:

\$10.00	- One half of 1921
\$20.00	- 1922
\$10.00	- One half of 1923
<u>\$40.00</u>	- Total

Under the procedure now in effect, and upon the approval of the Chapter to which you were formerly assigned, you could be reinstated upon the payment of \$25.00 for back dues, which would be applied to dues for the years 1931-1933, inclusive, and thereupon the Board has authority to remit the payment of any additional indebtedness.

You were assigned to the Florida Chapter, which has now been divided into three Chapters: Florida South, Florida Central, and Florida North. However, since you were located in Miami, you would have been included in the group of those assigned to the Florida South Chapter. The Secretary is Mr. Robert L. Weed, 2620 Biscayne Blvd., Miami. You should communicate with him with regard to obtaining the approval of the Chapter on your reinstatement to membership.

Upon reinstatement, you would be assigned to that Chapter. A transfer to the Maine Chapter, thereafter, could be effected promptly.

Meetings of the Institute Executive Committee and Board of Directors will commence in Washington on May 20th through the 25th or 26th. If you could complete your application before that, it could be submitted to the Executive Committee or Board of Directors

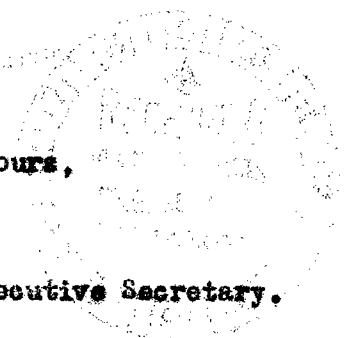

Dear Miss Gervais:

Your kind letter of November 13, 1957 received in answer to mine of November 7, 1957.

According to your letter, you defined my "Membership Status" in the Institute as "Your first tour of membership was terminated on July 1, 1923 and you were readmitted to corporate membership on November 15, 1945".

This is a peculiar situation and I will endeavor to explain it to you and, after you have considered same, would appreciate your suggestion relative to proper procedure necessary to bring this to the attention of the Jury of Fellows when they consider the nomination by Executive Committee of Florida South Chapter, A.I.A. of the writer for advancement to Fellowship.

On Page 6, A.I.A. Form S38, it was stated that "1921 - 1929 - (inclusive) Was active in Chapter affairs as member and chairman of various committees". This should be changed to read 1921 - 1927 - (Inclusive) instead of 1921 - 1929 - (Inclusive). There was a typographical error in stating 1929 instead of 1927.

But, if it were changed to "1927" this does not agree with your records and, since there are no records of the Chapter during that period in the files, will attempt to explain same. While serving as Secretary of Florida South Chapter, I searched through the files and all records of that period have disappeared and there are no records in the "President's or other files.

Naturally to attempt to reconstruct occurrences thirty (30) years ago which are dimmed by the hectic times occurring in the meantime, would require an exceptional memory so I will present the following facts relative to same to the best of my ability.

As I remember, at that time, our Chapter was affiliated with the Georgia Chapter and Richard Kiehnel, George Pfeifer and H. Hastings Mundy, all deceased were also members. The dues were nominal and Chapter procedure very muddled. Then the so-called "Boom Period" started in Florida and we were so engrossed with the "Financial Maelstrom" making money, that all else was neglected in the busy pace.

I have looked over some clippings of that time and, up to late 1926 used the initials "A.I.A.". after my name and I feel sure that, had I used the Institute designation improperly, other Architects would have objected as I was very prominent in this area at that time.

According to my recollection, in late 1926 I was appraised that I was dropped from Membership in the Institute and discontinued use of the designation. I was dropped for non-payment of dues as I ran the gamut, along with many others, from "Millionaire to Pauper" in a short period of time. In 1927 I left Miami and, after working in New York City for some time as a draftsman, went to Maine during the 1930 depression.

I returned to Miami in 1935 and my Florida State Registration was renewed since I had to drop same for financial reasons. I was in poor health at this time and did not renew my A.I.A. membership due to financial difficulties.

In 1942 I went to work for the Bell Aircraft Corporation at Marietta, Georgia and in 1945 returned to Miami and was readmitted to Corporate Membership in the Institute the same year.

In other words "I WENT THROUGH THE WRINGER" through no fault of mine.

Since the records of my Chapter affiliation are very indefinite from 1923 to 1927, which of the following procedures would you suggest I follow?



I am very sorry that this is the first opportunity I have had to check into The Institute's records with regard to your membership and in the light of your letter of January 2nd.

I find that in the printed minutes of the meeting of The Board of Directors of the A.I.A., held in May, 1923, reference was made to the effect that your membership was dropped as of July 1, 1923 on the recommendation of the Florida Chapter for non-payment of chapter dues. Also, that at that time you owed for A.I.A. dues for one-half of the year 1921, plus the years 1922 and 1923.

In looking into our correspondence files for that year I find considerable correspondence with you relative to your membership, copies of which are enclosed and which will refresh your memory.

Under the circumstances it would appear that your nomination for Fellowship should be corrected to show activities up to 1923 only. If you continued active in the chapter prior to your readmission and also continued to use the initials "A.I.A." such actions were without authority as a member of the A.I.A. It may be that the chapter records had not been changed as should have been done in 1923 to show the discontinuance of your membership at that time.
