James J. Foley, AIA, architect and managing partner of Kellam and Foley, Architects, Columbus, received a Bachelor of Architecture degree from The Ohio State University in 1950. Licensed to practice in Ohio, Michigan, Indiana, Kentucky, West Virginia, and Pennsylvania, he holds the National Council Certificate of the National Council of Architectural Registration Boards.

Mr. Foley is a member of AIA, the Architects Society of Ohio, AIA (member of the Board of Trustees and Executive Committee in 1969), Architectural Association of London, England, and Council of Educational Facilities Planners. Long active in civic affairs, he is a former officer in the U.S. Air Force, a licensed multi-engine pilot, and a member of the Civil Air Patrol.

In March, 1970, he was named a "Distinguished Alumni" of the College of Engineering of The Ohio State University in recognition of "distinguished achievement in one's profession by reason of significant inventions, important research or design, administrative leadership, or genius in production."

The firm which he founded in 1953, has won several awards for excellence in architecture, including the 1964 state award of the Ohio Prestressed Concrete Institute for Scioto Downs Race Track. Among awards given by the American Association of School Administrators to the firm are those for Big Walnut Middle School, Worthington Junior High, Oak Glen High School (Pughtown, W. Va.), the John Glenn High School (Walkertown, Ind.), and Wilson High School, voted as one of the ten best elementary schools in the U.S. in 1964.

Current projects include an administrative office complex for Ashland Oil, Ashland, Ky.; headquarters for Ashland Chemical, Dublin, Ohio; master plan for Ohio State's West Campus area, and Big Drum Manufacturing Plant, to be built in Columbus.

Mr. Foley resides at 1825 Snouffer Road in Worthington, Ohio.
