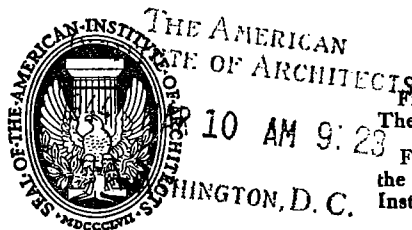

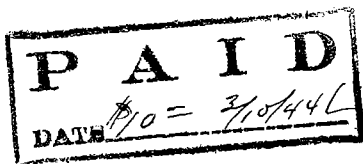

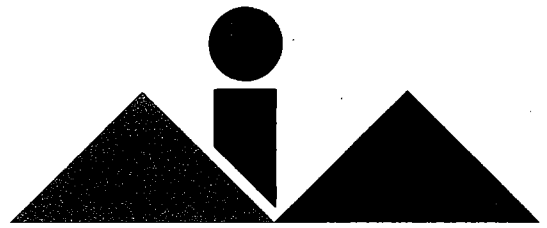

FRANZEN, ARCHIE WALDON, 76, of Washington Street, Harpers Ferry, died Thursday at the Jefferson Memorial Hospital.

Born Dec. 5, 1912, in Chicago, Ill., he was the son of the late Oscar Knuth and Julia Ebba Carison Franzen.

He was a 1936 graduate of the University of Illinois, receiving the Gargoyle Award for scholastic achievement in architecture; previously worked for the Dupont Co. in Crawford, Ind. and Wilmington, Del.; in 1956 he became an architect with the National Park Service, mainly served at the Harpers Ferry National Park, from which he retired in 1986 after 30 years of service; was a member of the American Institute of Architects, the West Virginia Society of Architects, the National Trust for Historical Preservation, the Jefferson County Historical Society, and the Jefferson County Landmarks Commission; was a member and past president of the Harpers Ferry Cooking Club; and was a member of Camp Hill-Wesley United Methodist Church where he served as trustee and member of the administrative board.

Surviving are his wife, Jeanne K. Franzen at home; two daughters, Virginia F. Thomson of Oakland, Calif. and J. Lisa Franzen of Harpers Ferry; and two grandchildren.

Funeral services will be held Sunday at 2 p.m. from the Eacles-Spencer Funeral Home in Harpers Ferry with the Rev. Temple G. Wheeler officiating. Burial will be in the Harper Cemetery in Harpers Ferry.

The family will receive friends at the funeral home on Saturday from 2 to 4 and 7 to 9 p.m.
