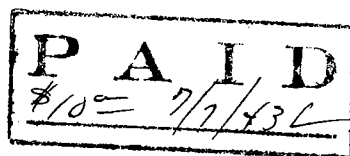

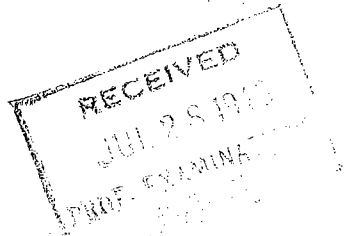

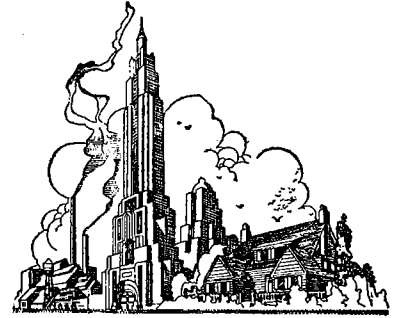

Raymond A. Freeburg, 80, an architect who specialized in designing churches and schools, died Friday at his home on 16th Street NW.

Mr. Freeburg was a native of Jamestown, N.Y. Most of the buildings he designed are in New York and Pennsylvania. He was a graduate of the Carnegie Institute of Technology in Pittsburgh.

The Freeburgs moved to Washington in 1953.

Mr. Freeburg was a

member of the American Institute of Architects and the Lions Club and was a 50-year member of St. John's Lodge No. 11 F.A.A.M.

He leaves his wife, Esther A.M.; a daughter, Patricia A., and a son, Raymond A., all of Washington, and a brother Herbert, of Orange City, Fla.

Services were to be held this morning at Hysong's Funeral Home, 1300 N. St. NW, with burial in Jamestown.
