In judging this contest the Jury gave first consisideration to the desirability of the apartments to tenants, to compact planning and to economical construction. These requirements were stressed in the competition program and are obviously essential for successful rental housing.

The Honorable Mention design by N.N.Culin, Architect, of New York City, a one story building of eight units, included a concise statement of the essential features of the problem and a clear presentation of the design.


