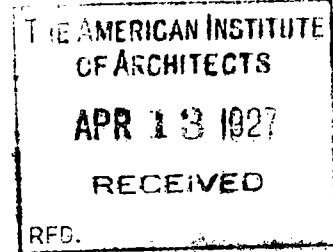

Dear Ned:

This is the first opportunity to respond seriatim to yours of March 15.

Fred A. Fuller - Northwestern Pennsylvania Chapter:

Membership terminated on December 31, 1937, at which time he owed Institute dues for 1936 and 1937 - \$40.00; and balance on a note - \$25.00. Total indebtedness - \$65.00.

J. Howard Hicks - Northwestern Pennsylvania Chapter:

Membership terminated on December 31, 1939, at which time he owed Institute dues for 1938 and 1939 - \$40.00; and a note of \$25.00. Total indebtedness - \$65.00.

Under the established procedure ^{each} reinstatement of these former members can be affected quickly if they will address a letter to The Secretary of The Institute applying for reinstatement and enclosing check covering the old indebtedness (which is \$65.00 in each case), plus \$5.00 admission fee, plus \$20.00 for the first twelve months following re-election. This makes a total of \$90.00 in each case.

If there are exceptional circumstances The Board might well consider your recommendation or that of the Northwestern Pennsylvania Chapter that the old indebtedness be remitted. In that event, the amount required of each to restore his membership would be \$25.00.

We are writing in a separate letter about the application of Mr. B. E. Starr.
