Dear Mr. Klapp:

This is in answer to your letter of January 15 about your recent membership termination.

The deadline for paying current dues is August 31. Your check for \$96 in payment of those dues is dated September 15, 1974. In our letter of October 31, we informed you that the Executive Committee authorized that the deadline for paying current dues be extended to December 1, 1974, and that we were therefore reinstating you without penalty. On November 21 you were informed by our accounting office that the \$96 check was returned to us because of insufficient funds, and to send us a replacement check by return mail.

While this was in process, of course, your name was being carried by virtue of your reinstatement and that is why you received a 1975 dues invoice. It was to cover the 1974 dues (\$96) plus 1975 dues (\$96).

No replacement check was received and your membership was terminated effective December 31.

In order to reinstate your membership, we will need additional payment of \$149 representing current regular dues (\$96) and the reinstatement fee (\$53).
