

**RESOLUTION ON THE DEATH OF**  
**STEVEN M. KRAUSE, AIA**

**Adopted by the AIA/CNY Chapter on October 21<sup>st</sup>, 2010**

WHEREAS, it is with deep regret and sincere sorrow, that the Board of Directors has been informed of the tragic and accidental death of STEVEN 'STEVE' M. KRAUSE, aged 50, a respected member of this organization for many years, on October 16<sup>th</sup>, 2010, in Syracuse, New York; and

WHEREAS, the memory of his friendship, his sense of humor, his character, and his outstanding career of service to his community and to this organization will long be cherished in the minds of his friends & colleagues; and

WHEREAS, Steven M. Krause joined the A.I.A. in 1984 and was an active and well respected member for many years, receiving many Chapter awards in recognition of his outstanding building designs; and

WHEREAS, Steven M. Krause, AIA, has served as a Treasurer of this Chapter in 1987, 1988, 1989; and

WHEREAS, Steven M. Krause, AIA, has served on the Board of Directors of this Chapter in 1987, 1988, 1989; and

WHEREAS, Steven was deeply involved in his community and served on the executive board of the Longhouse Council of the Boy Scouts of America, the Board of Directors of the Downtown Committee under the MDA; and

WHEREAS, Steven M. Krause was a principal of "QPK Design," from 1992 to 2010, and son of one of the founding partners Alfred F. Krause of the original architectural firm of Quinlivan Pierik and Krause; and

WHEREAS, Steven's impact as an architect was significant. His many works can be seen throughout the area, including such signature projects as the Panasci Family Chapel at LeMoyne College where memorial services were conducted in his honor, the Skaneateles Fire Station, the ecologically sustainable expansion of the Welch Allyn corporate headquarters in Skaneateles, and the refurbishment of the well known pier in Skaneateles. His many projects include work for academic institutions, including Skidmore College, Elmira College, Colgate University, Cornell University, St. Lawrence University, Hobart and William Smith College, the State University of New York at Cortland, Keuka College, Clarkson College, plus his alma mater, Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute; and


