SOME WEEKS AGO I WAS INFORMED BY A FELLOW ARCHITECT, A MAN MY SENIOR BY ABOUT 6 YEARS, THAT UPON REQUEST I COULD BE MADE A MEMBER EMERITUS AS HE WAS WHEN HE REACHED THE AGE OF 70.

MY RECOLLECTION IS THAT I JOINED THE NEW YORK CHAPTER OF THE INSTITUTE SOME 35 OR 40 YEARS AGO, THAT I RESIGNED WHEN I LEARNED THAT MY FRIEND - WHITNEY WARREN - HAD BEEN EXPELLED FROM THE INSTITUTE, WHICH I THOUGHT THEN WAS A GREAT INJUSTICE SINCE THE CRIME CHARGED HAD BEEN COMMITTED BY HIS PARTNER, WETMORE, WHO WAS NOT A MEMBER OF THE INSTITUTE. SUBSEQUENTLY I REJOINED THE CHAPTER AND JOINED THE INSTITUTE IN 1939. PERHAPS I AM WRONG IN MY DATES WHICH I CANNOT CHECK AS MY SECRETARY IS AWAY ON HER VACATION. HOWEVER, THIS WOULD INDICATE THAT I HAVE HAD AT LEAST 15 YEARS OF MEMBERSHIP.

MY CONTRIBUTION TO THE INSTITUTE IS A SMALL GROUP OF SUCCESSFUL ARCHITECTS, EDUCATED IN MY OFFICES, WHO ARE NOW FELLOWS OF THE INSTITUTE AND PRACTICING IN VARIOUS PARTS OF THE COUNTRY.

FOR YOUR RECORDS, I WAS BORN ON APRIL 10, 1880 AND HAVE BEEN IN ACTIVE PRACTICE FOR OVER A HALF CENTURY.
