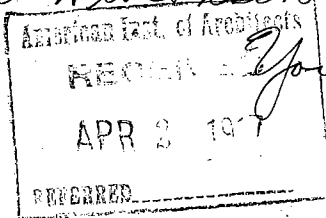

Dear Mr. Lippert:

It is with regret that we write to advise you of the termination of your membership in the American Institute of Architects, and in the Wisconsin Chapter, effective December 31, 1928.

This action results from the operation of the By-Laws of the Institute which, in 1928, required that the membership of the member who owed for more than one year be terminated, after due notice.

The By-Laws now in effect - as changed at the last Convention - give but one year for the payment of dues, because the Institute has found that it cannot carry on its activities without prompt payment by every member.

If you permit, we wish to say that the Treasurer, and the Officers of the Institute exceedingly regret to lose your membership for financial reasons. They hope that at some future date you will reconsider, and decide to again affiliate with the American Institute of Architects and the Chapter in your community.
