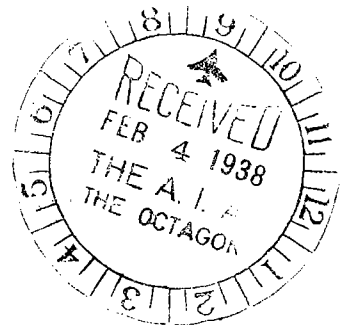

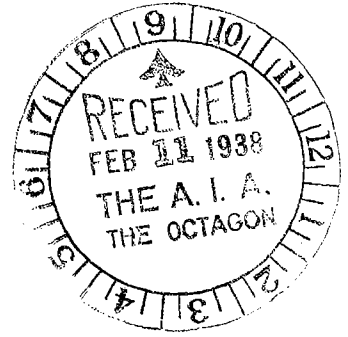

Sidney W. Little, Dean of the School of Architecture and Allied Arts at the University of Oregon, has announced his resignation from this administrative position and return to academic status as **Professor of Architecture**. The change is to be effective July first of this year and will be followed by a six month sabbatical leave for travel in Europe and the United States before returning to the University of Oregon in January 1959. He has been in this administrative post for the past twelve years, and came to Oregon from the Alabama Polytechnic Institute, where for the previous eight years he was Associate Professor of Architecture.

During the past years in Oregon Dean Little has been prominent in both American Institute of Architects and professional affairs and more recently has been deeply concerned with the problems of complete rehousing and organization of the extensive program of the Oregon School of Architecture. The extensive new quarters of the School are now being occupied and will have public dedication early in the spring of 1958. Several years ago as a member of the survey commission for the American Institute of Architects he contributed

to the group of recommendations for strengthening the program of education for the professional practice of architecture. He later served on the A.I.A. national and regional committee on education on the program for implementation of these items. He is currently chairman of the Committee of the Association of Collegiate Schools of Architecture for their major program in post-graduate refresher education for the architect in private practice.

The Dean plans to continue his work with the Oregon Capitol Planning Commission on his return from leave. This commission has recently been concerned with a recommendation for a long range developmental scheme for the Capitol Mall, covering anticipated building requirements for the next fifty years.

While on leave Dean Little will investigate the graduate offerings in architecture at schools similar to Oregon. He will also examine recent developments in contemporary design and structure in anticipation of teaching responsibilities in these directions after his return to Oregon.

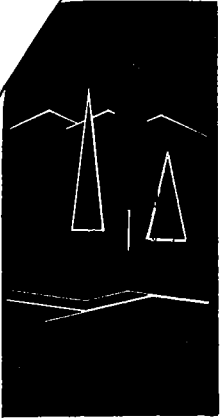
