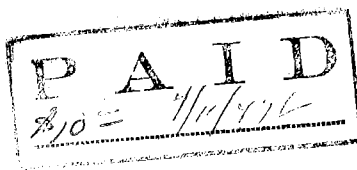

Mr. Lopez studied architecture at Cornell University's College of Architecture and was subsequently engaged in architectural practice in and around New York City between 1927 and 1935. He then joined the staff of *American Architect* and has since been an editor and consultant, specializing in educational plant needs and design, for principal architectural journals.

He has been Managing Editor and Technical Editor of *Progressive Architecture*, Associate Editor and Senior Editor of *Architectural Record*, and recently served as a special consultant on secondary school problems to the *Architectural Forum*.

Well known to many of the country's leading architects, Mr. Lopez is a member of the American Institute of Architects, a former officer of its New York Chapter,

and has served with several of its local and national committees. He is also a member of the American Association of School Administrators, the Architectural League of New York and of the New York State Association of Architects. He has occasionally executed small architectural commissions. His principal contribution, however, has been in the field of architectural writing, criticism and teaching.

Mr. Lopez has taught architectural subjects at Columbia University and has written extensively for professional and popular magazines. His published work has been based on wide travel, studying the needs of education in relation to the architectural design of school and college buildings.
