WASHINGTON, D.C.--Rex Lotery, AIA, of Santa Monica was formally installed as a member of the Board of The American Institute of Architects in ceremonies held here on December 7. Elected for a 3-year term as AIA Regional Director for California, Lotery is a partner in the Santa Monica firm of Kahn Kappe Lotery-Architects Planners.

Also installed were: 1974 president Archibald C. Rogers, FAIA, of Baltimore; first vice president (president-elect) William Marshall Jr., FAIA, of Norfolk, Va.; three national vice presidents, Van B. Bruner Jr., AIA, of Haddonfield, N.J.; Louis R. Lundgren, FAIA, of St. Paul, Minn., and John M. McGinty, AIA, of Houston; and treasurer, Joseph Tuchman, FAIA, of Akron, Ohio.
