Top Architect, International Critic Lead List Of Participants in CCAIA Design Conference

SAN FRANCISCO ---- Reyner Banham, celebrated architecture critic and professor of art history, and Anthony J. Lumsden, FAIA, Director of Design for the architectural firm of Daniel, Mann, Johnson & Mendenhall (DMJM), lead the list of 101 professionals who will participate in "California 101," the first annual Monterey/Carmel Design Conference March 27-30, sponsored by the California Council, the American Institute of Architects.

It is expected that nearly 500 design professionals, students and guests will attend the three day celebration of California architectural design, which will be headquartered at the Doubletree Inn and Monterey Conference Center in Monterey, California.

Known nationally and internationally for his interest in and support of Southern California architecture, British architectural historian and critic Banham will join with New York journalist William Marlin and San Francisco architect Robert B. Marquis, FAIA, in an opening night (March 27) panel discussion on California design directions. The panel will address the future of California architecture from their various perspectives, with audience participation encouraged.

Marlin is Associate Editor of the Architectural Record, and
Architecture and Urban Design Critic for the Christian Science Monitor.
Before beginning his career in journalism, he received a degree in

Kamrath, Mies van der Rohe and Bertrand Goldberg. Marquis, an awardwinning San Francisco architect, was elected to the American Institute of Architects College of Fellows in 1970, and received the Albert John Evers Award for Environmental Design in 1975. In 1979 he received a Northern California Chapter AIA Award of Excellence for the interior design of the St. Francic Yacht Club. A study of his firm was published in the Architectural Record in November, 1978.

Banham is regarded as an individualist in his field among his colleagues in Europe, in that he has written favorably on architecture in California, with a particular emphasis on Los Angeles. His book, "Los Angeles, the Architecture of Four Ecologies," is a much-quoted reference on the subject. Says Banham, "I see Los Angeles as a unique phenomenon, not a model or prototype of doom, and I see myself as a reporter rather than a profound critic rushing to judgement." Currently on the faculty of the University of California at Santa Cruz, Banham has a background in aeronautical engineering, art history and architecture. He was schooled in London, and spent several years there in both editorial and professorial capacities. He then spent three years on the staff of the State University of New York at Buffalo, and relocated to California early this year.

Lumsden is the Principal for Design and Vice President at DMJM in Los Angeles. During the last five years, DMJM has won more than 30 awards for architectural design, and Lumsden himself has received awards from the American Institute of Architects, the Department of Housing and Urban Development, the American Institute of Steel Construction, the

Portland Cement Association, the National Society of Professional Engineers, Progressive Architecture Magazine, the Consulting Engineers Association, and the Institute of Human Engineering Sciences. Lumsden's work has appeared in more than a dozen national and international professional journals. He will be making an in-depth presentation on one of his projects at the Design Conference.

Along with DMJM's Lumsden, three from the ranks of the "101" architects will make multi-media in-depth presentations of a single project from inception through occupancy. Craig Hodgetts of Studio Works, Hollywood; Donn Logan, AIA, ELS Design Group, Berkeley; and Jon Jerde, AIA, The Jerde Partnership, Los Angeles, will each take the podium for an hour on Saturday (March 29).

Special presentations will be made by two non-architects. Michael Pittas, Director of the Design Arts Program of the National Endowment for the Arts, will discuss the NEA Grant Program, and outline who receives grants, and why and how they get them. A Sunday (March 30) morning demonstration of aerial forms, specifically kites of all sizes and designs, will be presented by Tom Van Sant, Los Angeles sculptor, painter and muralist. Van Sant has completed over 40 architectural commissions. Weather permitting, he will launch a 140 foot kite which provides a ladder to climb to the sky, a prototype of a mile-long kite he is currently designing.

In addition to the featured presentations, the conference will offer a forum for discussion with multi-media team presentations, which will emphasize such concepts as solar and energy-conscious design, historic and adaptive reuse of buildings, design involving extensive citizen and community input, and design of environments for people with special needs. Twelve teams of architects will make these overview presentations on Friday (March 28).

Presentations will be only a part of the interactive process that will occur between the "101" architects and conference attendees. In addition, one-on-one informal discussion and debate will take place during "time between" scheduled programs throughout the three days. Currently eleven architects are scheduled to be available at all times for informal consultation, and all of the "101" will be free for consultation at times when they are not presenting.

Included in the design professionals expected at "California 101" are graphic designers, interior designers, industrial designers, as well as architects and other professionals interested in architectural design. Also expected to attend the conference are over 20 media representatives from around the country.

The Doubletree Inn and Monterey Conference Center are located adjacent to the world famed Fisherman's Wharf in Monterey. There will be several opportunities for conference attendees to enjoy the recreational features of the area. The conference registration fee is \$180 for design professionals; \$80 for associate architects; and \$45 for students. 2. Describe the qualities of the nominee's design which are considered to have contributed notably to the advancement of the profession:

A significant aspect of the nominee's design has been the relationship of solution to specific sites and environments. The most influential contribution has been the development of a membrane aesthetic. In the nominee's buildings of this design type the relationship between form, function, structure, facade and enclosure have been examined. Associated with this is the assessment of the building form relative to its specific existing built environment.

Another contribution is the development of various solutions using a variable form aesthetic. These solutions examine the relationship of vernacular to monumental building aesthetics.
