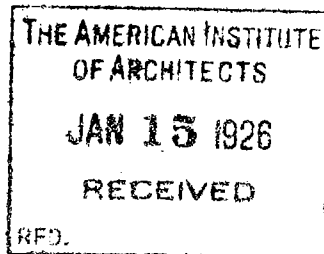

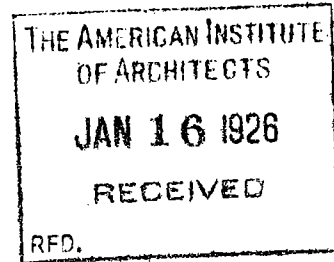


Dear Sir:-

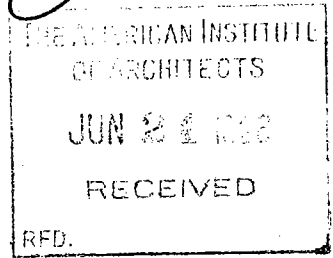
