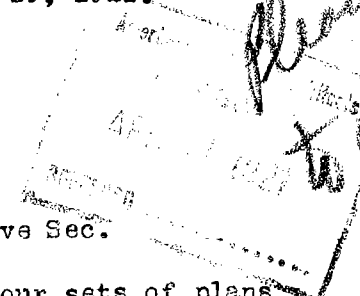

I am sending you, under separate cover, four sets of plans and three sets of photographs of the different buildings which have been prepared under my supervision during the last four years.

Permit me to call your attention to the fact that two sets of drawings, one concerning the First National Bank, Rogers Park, Chicago, and the other- Apartment Building for Mrs. E. S. Theurer, are signed by Frederick J. Teich, Architect, and K. M. Vitzthum, Architect, for Vitzthum & Teich Co. I have been a 50% owner of this company, which has been dissolved two years ago.

The remaining two sets of drawings, - one for the State Savings Bank, Lawler, Iowa, and the addition to Sulphur Lick Springs Hotel, Wedron, Illinois, have been prepared in my office under my supervision in the last two years.

Dear Mr. Teich:

You hold a national membership in The American Institute of Architects, and also a membership in its Chicago Chapter.

These professional affiliations are valued by the two societies, and we believe they are valued by you.

We are just in receipt of a letter from the Secretary of the Chicago Chapter, advising that your Chapter dues have remained unpaid for some time. We find, here, that your dues to the Institute remain unpaid for the years 1929 and 1930, in the sum of \$50.00.

Under the established Institute procedure each member is expected to keep current his dues in his Chapter, as well as in the national society. This is a fair and reasonable provision because, as you know, the Institute and the Chapter are entirely dependent upon the dues of their members for carrying on the work which they do for the profession as a whole.

The purpose of this letter is to let you know the situation, and to express the earnest hope that you will square the account with the Chicago Chapter by sending a check to the Secretary, Mr. Carl E. Heimbrot, 20 North Wacker Drive, Chicago. If you will do this it will completely restore you to good standing in the Chapter, and will permit us, here, at The Octagon, to take your name off the list of those who are delinquent to their Chapters.

The Institute is composed of small <sup>or</sup> group of men, scattered over the United States. It is a thin spread. The Society needs every one of its members, and it will be disappointed if it loses your support.

The next meeting of the Institute Executive Committee, when it will act on the lists of delinquent members, is scheduled for September. May we hear from you before then?
