




Unfortunately, I was unable to attend the December meeting of the Jacksonville Chapter of the A. I. A. By copy of a letter from Mr. Eugene Cellar, Chapter President, to you dated December 31, 1957, I was notified of the Chapter motion to transfer my membership from the Jacksonville Chapter of the A. I. A. "... to a Chapter in Georgia which would be closer to his place of practice." It is not my desire to join a chapter in which the membership feels I do not belong. However, I do not believe the members realize that there are only three chapters in Georgia:

The Georgia Chapter in Atlanta - 250 miles
The South Georgia Chapter in Savannah - 170 miles
The Augusta Chapter in Augusta - 240 miles

The reason for my initial request for membership in the Jacksonville Chapter was because Jacksonville (110 miles) is closer to Valdosta than any of the three Georgia Chapters.

I am, by copy of this letter to Mr. Cellar, requesting the Jacksonville Chapter to reconsider the motion of the December 10th meeting. Will you please withhold your decision until after the Jacksonville Chapter has reviewed this motion.



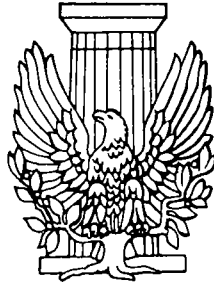
