

In reply to your letter of March 5, 1943, concerning Mr. Theodore W. Lamb and his work with OCD, I wish to advise that Mr. Lamb was on a very important mission for this agency at the time of his death in the plane crash in Lisbon.

He was to have been an attache at the American Embassy in London and was to have served as a special observer for the Office of Civilian Defense in London. As he had not been associated with this office previously I can add only that we regarded him as highly qualified to undertake this mission because of his work as an architect in this country and the special studies he had made in European countries.

As you doubtless know, he had long been interested in aviation and airport design, a study begun in preparing his graduation thesis at Yale and carried out subsequently under the Matcham Fellowship with a study of airports and conferences with architects in Germany, Austria, Sweden and Holland.

He had spent parts of eight separate years in specialized training in England and French universities and in extensive travel in Austria, Germany and Italy. You probably have a record of his work as an architect and an engineer in this country, largely in association with Winston Elting, Paul Schweikher and George Fred Keck.
