He received his training as an architect and engineer in Haifa and as an art historian at the Institute of Fine Arts of New York University and Columbia University. His articles on architecture have appeared in scholarly journals; he has assisted Professor E. Porada with drawings in her *Art of Ancient Iran* and various articles, and Professor R. Krautheimer with plans and reconstructions in his *Early Christian and Byzantine Architecture*. Since his arrival in the United States he has worked in New York City as a practicing architect, for the last years as associate and design coordinator of a large architectural firm.
