

His recent church buildings show his increasing concern for colaboration of the artist craftsman and the architect and in his Arroyo Seco Regional Branch Library, due to a very restricted site, developed roof parking which contributed greatly to the sucess of the project.

Mr. Landon has worked for the profession and its relationship with the public during his almost twenty years as a member of the Institute. He has always had a great interest in and taken part in all the activities that would promote the welfare of the profession with the public. In addition to his participation in the work of the Chapter and California Council, has always worked closely with the whole construction industry and local authorities.

Los Angeles City has embarked on an ambitious program of slum clearance, re-habilitation and conservation. These civic objectives often come in conflict with the individual citizen and the Appeals Board acts to prevent undue hardship in the enforcement of these codes. As the architect on the board Mr. Landon has been able help in the solution of many knotty conflicts between city and citizen and indicate our professions regard for both private and public welfare.

Appointed by Mayor of Los Angeles to Citizens Urban Renewal Committee. Representing Los Angeles Chamber of Commerce and Los Angeles Beautiful 1957-58-59-60-61. Served on the Committees Legal and Legislative Committee.

This is a citizen committee concerning itself with the problems of Urban Renewal. Mr. Landon is one of the several architects serving on this committee who are well able to make their influence felt with the bureaucrats and laymembers. Mr. Landons committee, Legal and Legislative, studied legislature bills and legal rulings with special emphasis on the re-housing of those people displaced by the program and aid to the elderly and needy.
