



Lester S. LaPierre, 85; Architect Had Designed Large Country Homes

Lester S. LaPierre, a retired architect, died Sunday at his home in Sea Cliff, L.I. He was 85 years old.

Mr. LaPierre retired in 1964 as a senior partner of LaPierre, Litchfield and Partnes, now known as Litchfield Grosfeld Associates.

A graduate of the Columbia University School of Architecture, Mr. LaPierre designed large private country residences and a number of public buildings. Among his clients were the Heinz and

Among his clients were the Heinz and Scaife families, for whom he designed large homes outside Pittsburgh, and the Armours of Chicago.

During World War II he was active on defense projects, among them the United States Merchant Marine Academy at Kings Point, L.I.

More recent projects included the B. Altman store at Manhasset, L.I., Veterans Administration hospitals in New York City and Pittsburgh, the Thule Air Force Base in Greenland and the Union Central Medical Center in Ragoon, Burma.

He leaves his wife, the former Joan Straat, a son, Douglas B. a retired Navy captain, and two grandchildren.
