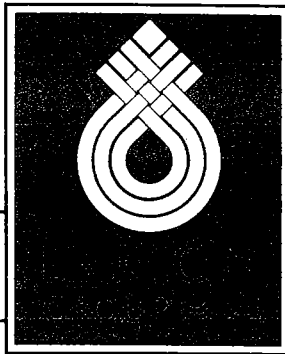

Dear Fellow Architect:

In this last month my business came to an abrupt end when my remaining two men took jobs with another firm at the same time because of large salary increases which I was unable to match.

Next came the problem of relocation or retrenchment into my house. This had to be done as fast as possible and with as little expense as possible. This meant my back and a single helper. Twentytwo years accumulation had to be reduced to the size of my garage.

I have never missed a payment to support our organization. At this writing it finds me in debt and I plead for help and understanding for those unfortunate architects which are in the same predicament. I agree that basing the assessment on the last year 1972 payroll tax is about as fair a way as can be devised.

However, under the present circumstances is there no help that can be extended for the architect who must start over at the bottom.

I do not wish to be dropped from the roll and dishonored after seventeen years as Corporate Member. I shall be glad to work with the A. I. A. by making payments as money becomes available, but in all fairness I do not believe that my dues should be imposed based on a year that I had a working organization as compared to my present meager circumstance.

I have helped the organization for these many years and now for the first time I turn to ask for help not charity.

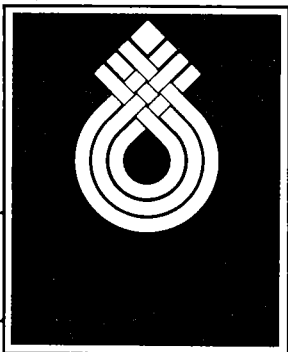


