Dear Mr. Laschenski:

It is with regret that we write to advise you of the termination of your membership in the American Institute of Architects, and in the Philadelphia Chapter, effective December 31, 1928.

This action results from the operation of the By-Laws of the Institute which, in 1928, required that the membership of the member who owed for more than one year be terminated, after due notice.

The By-laws now in effect - as changed at the last Convention - give but one year for the payment of dues, because the Institute has found that it cannot carry on its activities without prompt payment by every member.

If you will permit, we wish to say that the Treasurer, and the Officers of the Institute exceedingly regret to lose your membership for financial reasons. They hope that at some future date you will reconsider, and decide to again affiliate with the American Institute of Architects and the Chapter in your community.

Applicants for reinstatement must also be clear of any indebtedness to the chapter to which they were formerly assigned.


Therefore, your letter should be accompanied by your check in the amount of \$80.00.

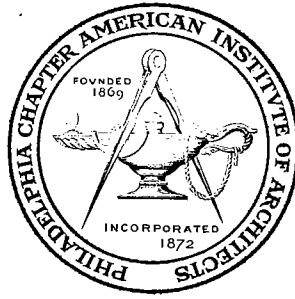

YOU PROBABLY KNOW THAT DURING LAST WINTER AN APPLICATION WAS MADE FOR RE-INSTATEMENT OF THE MEMBERSHIP OF SIGMUND J. LASCHENSKI TO THE PHILADELPHIA CHAPTER.

FROM WHAT I UNDERSTAND, THE PROCESSING OF HIS APPLICATION WAS SLOWED UP, FIRST, BECAUSE OF THE YEARLY ACTIVITIES IN CONJUNCTION WITH THE A.I.A. CONVENTION AT HUSTON AND, SECONDLY, BECAUSE OF THE PENDING CHANGE OF RELATIONSHIP OF THE PHILADELPHIA CHAPTER TO THE INSTITUTE THROUGH THE P.S.A.

UNDER THE SET-UP, SIGMUND WOULD HAVE BECOME A MEMBER OF THE P.S.A. AND ASSIGNED TO THE PHILADELPHIA CHAPTER. NOW I SHOULD THINK SIGMUND COULD BE IMMEDIATELY ASSIGNED TO THE PHILADELPHIA CHAPTER. I WOULD LIKE TO ASK YOU, IF AT ALL POSSIBLE, TO CUT THROUGH ALL OF THE RED TAPE AND REINSTATE SIGMUND AT THE EARLIEST POSSIBLE MOMENT SO THAT HE CAN PARTICIPATE IN OUR ACTIVITIES FOR THE COMING SEASON. THE MOST IMPORTANT PHASE OF THIS HOWEVER IS THE EFFECT OF SUCH DELIBERATIONS ON A MAN WHO HAS ALREADY BEEN A MEMBER OF THE INSTITUTE. IT MUST BE VERY DISCONCERTING TO HIM AND I THINK THAT WE SHOULD DO SOMETHING IMMEDIATELY TO CONSUMMATE HIS REINSTATEMENT.

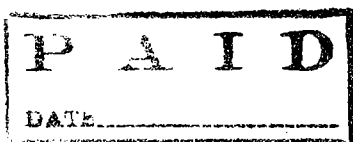

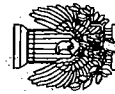
