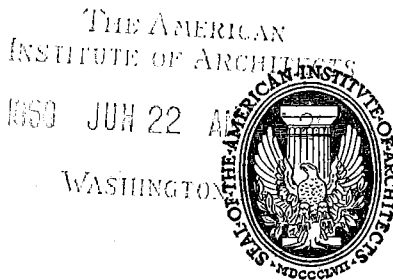

Thank you for your prompt reply to our letter re Mr. Elmo K. Lathrop.

Our Executive Committee voted to accept Mr. Lathrop as a member, providing the problem of unpaid dues from 1961 and 1962 can be satisfactorily resolved. Mr. Lathrop explained that when he moved to Arizona in 1957, he was able to keep in touch with his former Chapter for several years.
