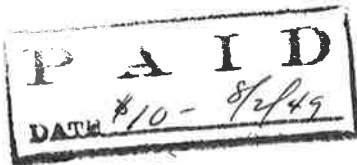

Such cards are of no set pattern, although they generally are of a size 4" x 6", or smaller. The wording and printing are always dignified, but should be of sufficient length to convey the message clearly.

A sample might read as follows:

"THE FIRM OF JONES AND SMITH, A.I.A., ARCHITECTS,

TAKES PLEASURE IN WELCOMING TO PARTNERSHIP

WILLIAM E. BROWN, A.I.A.

AND ANNOUNCES THE CHANGE IN NAME OF THE FIRM TO

JONES, SMITH AND BROWN, A.I.A., ARCHITECTS.

The firm will maintain its offices at its present address, 116 Main Street, Baton Rouge, Louisiana."

A very similar form is used for the announcement of the appointment of Associates to the firm.
