Student
Level:

Her continued encouragement to students, particularly at Georgia Tech, by actually working with them on AIA activities on the Student Chapter level, as well as on the National Association of Student Chapters' level. She suggested the first National Association Regional Convention, and helped to develop the program; she has done this same thing for the second Convention and is already assisting in the third program, for 1968. She has personally been responsible, through contribution of funds, for a student attending each National Student Forum since the inception of these programs; and for a student attending each AIA Convention, since AIA started having student programs at the Conventions. Her contributions of funds have always been given anonymously.

She instigated and helped to direct establishment of the Student Participation Program at AIA and its first participant was the President of the National Student Association, who was also a student at Georgia Tech.

Chapter
Level:

Served for a year as First Vice-President, a year as Second Vice-President; and as a Director for eleven years, all elective positions. She was Chairman of Student Affairs for 2 years, as well as Chairman of Chapter Affairs Committee for 2 years.

State
Level:

Responsible for the ultimate unification of the AIA Chapters in Georgia, resulting in the organization of the Georgia Council, AIA. Because of her outstanding leadership in this direction, elected and served 18 months as the Council's first President. Has been Director since that time. Wrote first By-Laws for the Council and keeps them up to date. Served on Special State Committee to review complaint of State work. This became considerably more complicated than was ever anticipated, but her performance of the job was a credit to the profession and resulted in her being cited by the President of the Chapter at that time.

Regional
Level:

Now serving three-year term as Secretary-Treasurer of South Atlantic Regional Council. Re-wrote Regional By-Laws. Continues to keep them up to date.

Chapter
Division
Level:

Personally responsible for establishing Macon Division of the North Georgia Chapter. It is through her efforts and inspiration that this organization has remained active each year. President of the Division in 1957 and Vice-President in 1958.

Community
Level:

Has represented the architectural profession in the cultural life of Macon through her service on the Board of the Macon Little Theatre for 35 years; serving as designer of sets and then as person responsible for the design of the sets, during which time she inspired many young architects in the Macon community to become interested in the Little Theatre.

In the humane life of the community, has served as AIA's representative on the State Department of Mental Health's Citizens Council and the County's Board of Mental Health

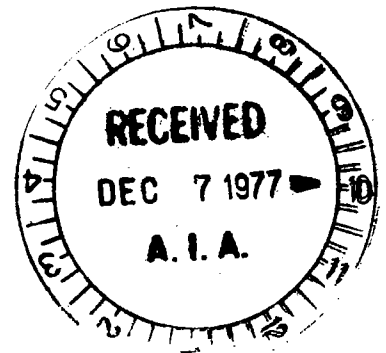

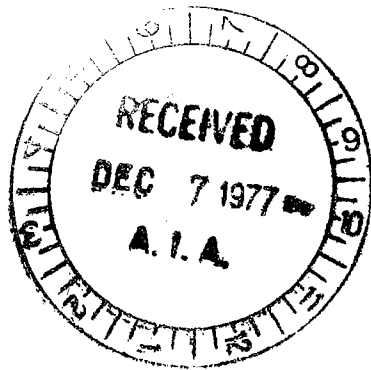


