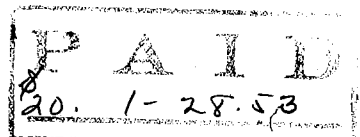

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DIGEST OF THE CAREER AND ACHIEVEMENTS OF

ALLEN YUEN LEW  
(nominee)

The San Joaquin Chapter of the American Institute of Architects nominates ALLEN YUEN LEW, A.I.A. for Fellowship for his outstanding Achievement in Design and, particularly, in Public Service, as well as his substantial contribution in Service to the Profession.

Mr. Lew's creative ability in Design has set a standard of excellence which has had a profound influence on both his fellow architects and fellow citizens in his area. His work has won many awards, including three awards of excellence, two awards of honor and one award of merit. Projects so honored include an Air Terminal, a Church, a Public Library, an Apartment Complex, and a Residence. His solutions to these complex projects with its air of simplicity and restraint has been his outstanding stamp of achievement. The accompanying photographs of this work are, of course, the ultimate evidence of Mr. Lew's personal creativity and special talent in Design. ?

In the field of Public Service, Mr. Lew's first significant activity followed his appointment to the Fresno Planning Commission by Mayor Selland when the mayor was charged with the change-over from an antiquated commission form of government to the city manager form. Mr. Lew was given the specific mission of bringing to that body an objective professional approach to the problems of city planning, zoning and variances, as opposed to the previous uninformed and short-sightedly political decisions of that body.

After some three years in this activity and in recognition of his effectiveness in achieving his goals, Mr. Lew was then appointed as a Member of the Fresno Redevelopment Agency. He became the leading advocate of the development and acceptance of the new plan for the downtown business and Civic Center area whose principal features, a pedestrian mall, new traffic patterns and parking facilities, have revitalized Fresno's downtown area. This was in the late nineteen fiftys when these features were just beginning to come to the fore-front of urban design and for these, the "Fresno Downtown Mall" received national recognition particularly from the American Institute of Architects.

His interest to his city has continued through his association with the Fresno Civic Center Development Committee and the Fresno Downtown Association.

Furthermore, in each of his associations with various services such as Rotary International, Boy Scouts of America, the Chinese American Citizens Alliance, the Confucius Church, planning played an important part of his participation and services to his community.

For Rotary Internation, he designed the Rotary Playland Park with its rides and festive surrounding to please many generations of youngsters. For the Boy Scouts of America, the master planning of Camp Chawanekee and the construction of its dining hall. For the Chinese American Citizens Alliance and the Confucius School, Mr. Lew's contribution to the planning of the Chinese Community Center with its churches, schools and clubhouse formed the nucleus of a continuing contribution of Chinese cultures to the residents of the city of his birth.

Statewide, Mr. Lew was appointed by the Governor to serve a term on the

original board of the Designers Qualification Advisory Committee under the auspices of the California Board of Architectural Examiners.

In service to the profession, Mr. Lew has served as President, Secretary, Treasurer and Director of the San Joaquin Chapter A.I.A. as well as Chairman of various committees. He has also served as Director (3 years), Treasurer (2 years) and various committees of the California Council, A.I.A.
