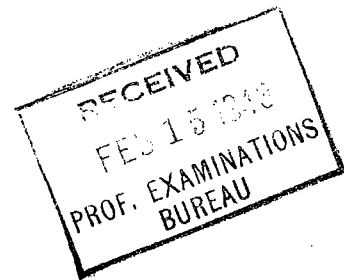

We are sorry to learn from your letter of July 11th that you wish to discontinue your membership in The Institute and the Detroit Chapter.


