## TO EVERY ARCHITECT IN THE UNITED STATES AND ITS POSSESSIONS:

The Architects' Roster is maintained by The American Institute of Architects as a service to the profession as a whole and to agencies of the United States Government. Every registered architect, whether or not a member of The Institute, is eligible for inclusion in the Roster. The Institute maintains custody of the Roster, keeps it up to date and in good order for use. The Roster is available to any representative of the Government and to representatives of foreign governments in Washington. Reference may be made to The Architects' Roster in negotiations with government agencies and other interested parties. Experience with the Roster since its establishment in 1946 has shown its usefulness. Growing out of an earlier Register of architects qualified for public works, The Roster provides at The Octagon an accurate, current record of the qualifications and achievements of members of the profession. It allows a positive and helpful response to requests for factual information on architects, and in that way constitutes a service to the profession.

The American Institute of Architects assumes no responsibility for the accuracy of statements made in this Questionnaire. The obligation to maintain this record as a current description of an architectural firm rests with the firm, and supplementary record forms are available for this purpose.

#### MILITARY EXPERIENCE

- 1917-1919 -- Enlisted as private, C. of E., November 14, 1917. Commissioned 2nd Lieutenant, C of E, March 18, 1918. Promoted to 1st Lieut., C of E, September 12, 1918. Discharged honorably February 1, 1919.
- 1920-1940 -- Commissioned 1st Lieut. C of E Reserve, April 27, 1920. Active in CRC over period of years from 1920 to 1940.
- 1940-1942 Ordered to active duty as Major, C of E, August 8, 1940, and detailed to Constructing Quartermaster, Ft. Sam Houston, Texas. Active in cantonment and air field construction in Eighth Corps Area. Zone Architect, Eighth Construction Zone 1941 to 1942 with supervision over preparation of plans and specifications for division cantonments, general and station hospitals, air fields, depots and ordnance storage. Promoted to Lieutenant Colonel, C of E, January, 1941.
- 1942-1943 --- Ordered to Camp Claiborne, Louisiana, assigned to Engineer Troops, activating, organizing and training engineer regiments. Departed for Port of Embarkation with 331st Engineers, General Service Regiment, August, 1942. Arrived Alaska, October 1942, assigned to construction of Alaska Barge Terminal. Promoted to Colonel, C of E, October 13, 1942.
- 1943-1944 -- Resident Engineer, Umnak, Alaska. Special engineer on depot project, Adak. Assistant to Staff Engineer, Alaska Department, on paving Aleutians airfields, expediting construction on ferry command air lines to Russia. Returned to U.S., October, 1944.
- 1944-1945 -- Ordered to Engineer Training Section, Ft. Lewis, Washington, to activate, organize and train Engineer General Service Regiment.

  Ordered to command of Engineer Training Group. Separated from service October 11, 1945. Accepted commission Colonel, C of E, Reserve, effective February 4, 1946.
