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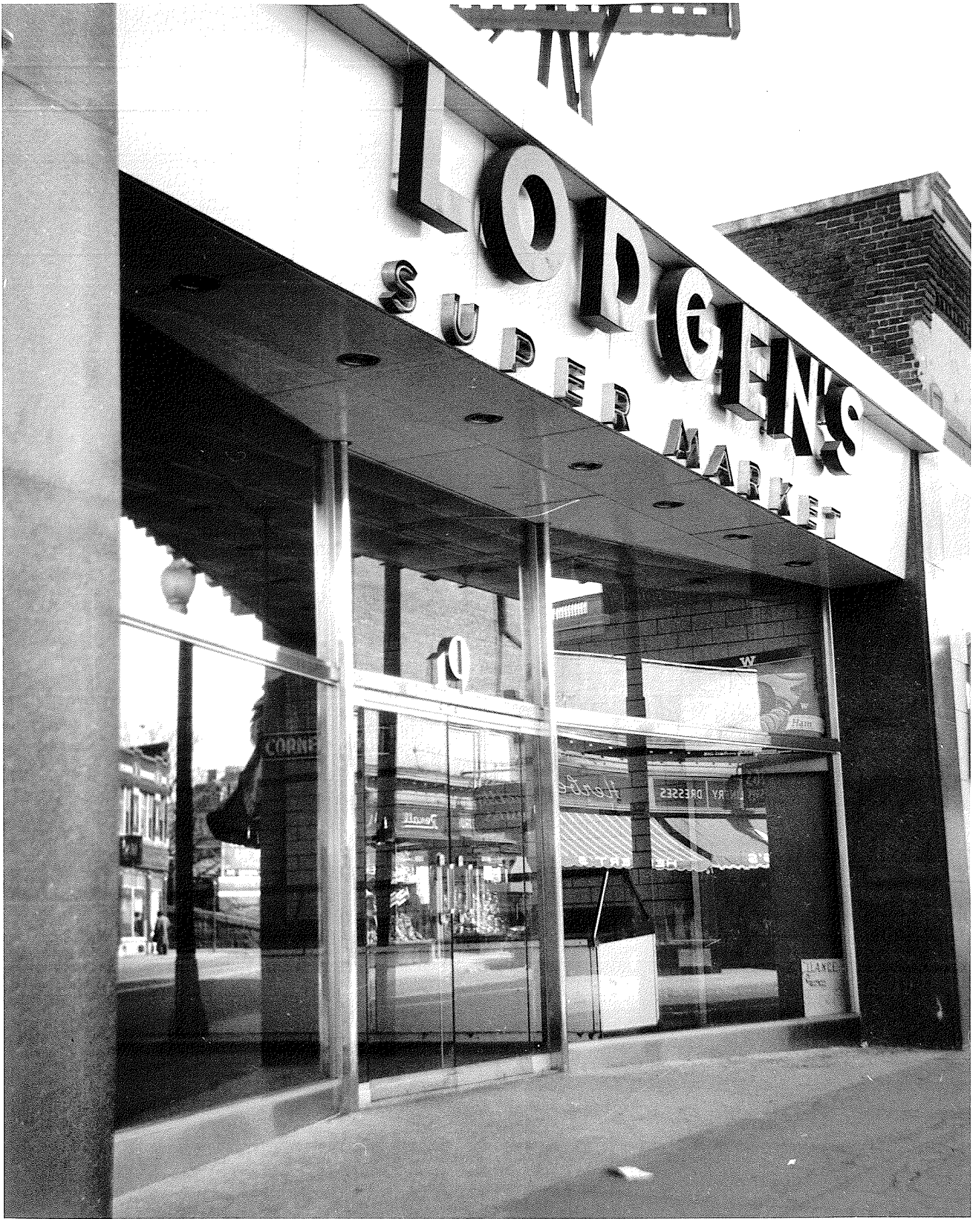
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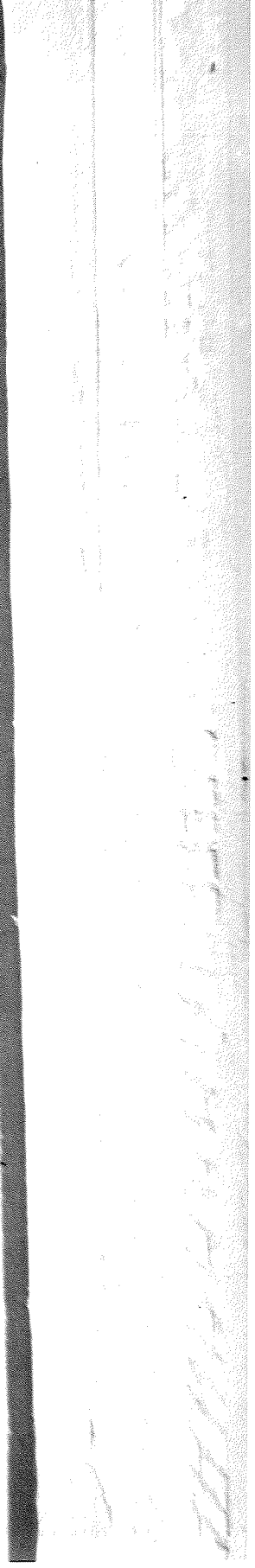
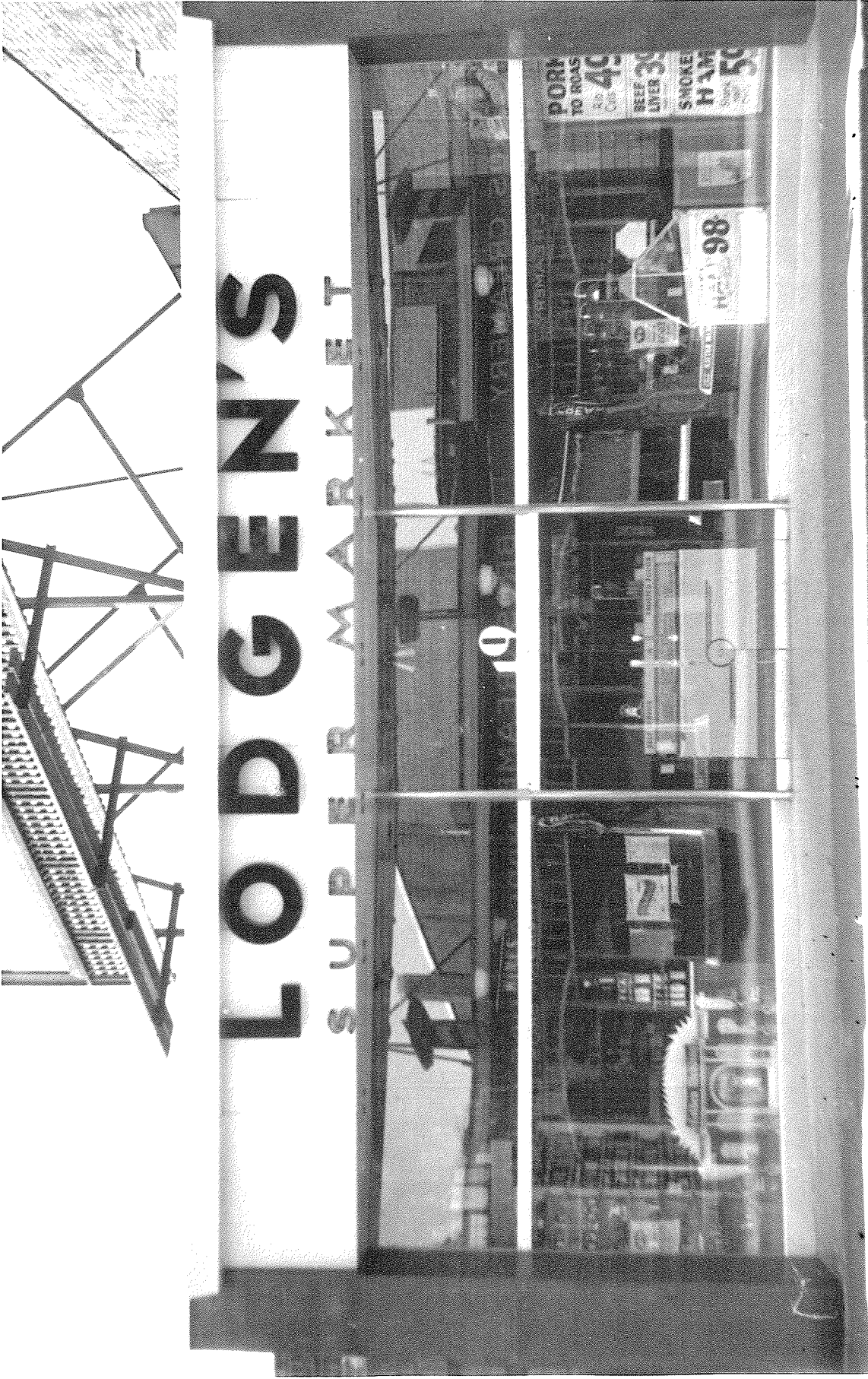
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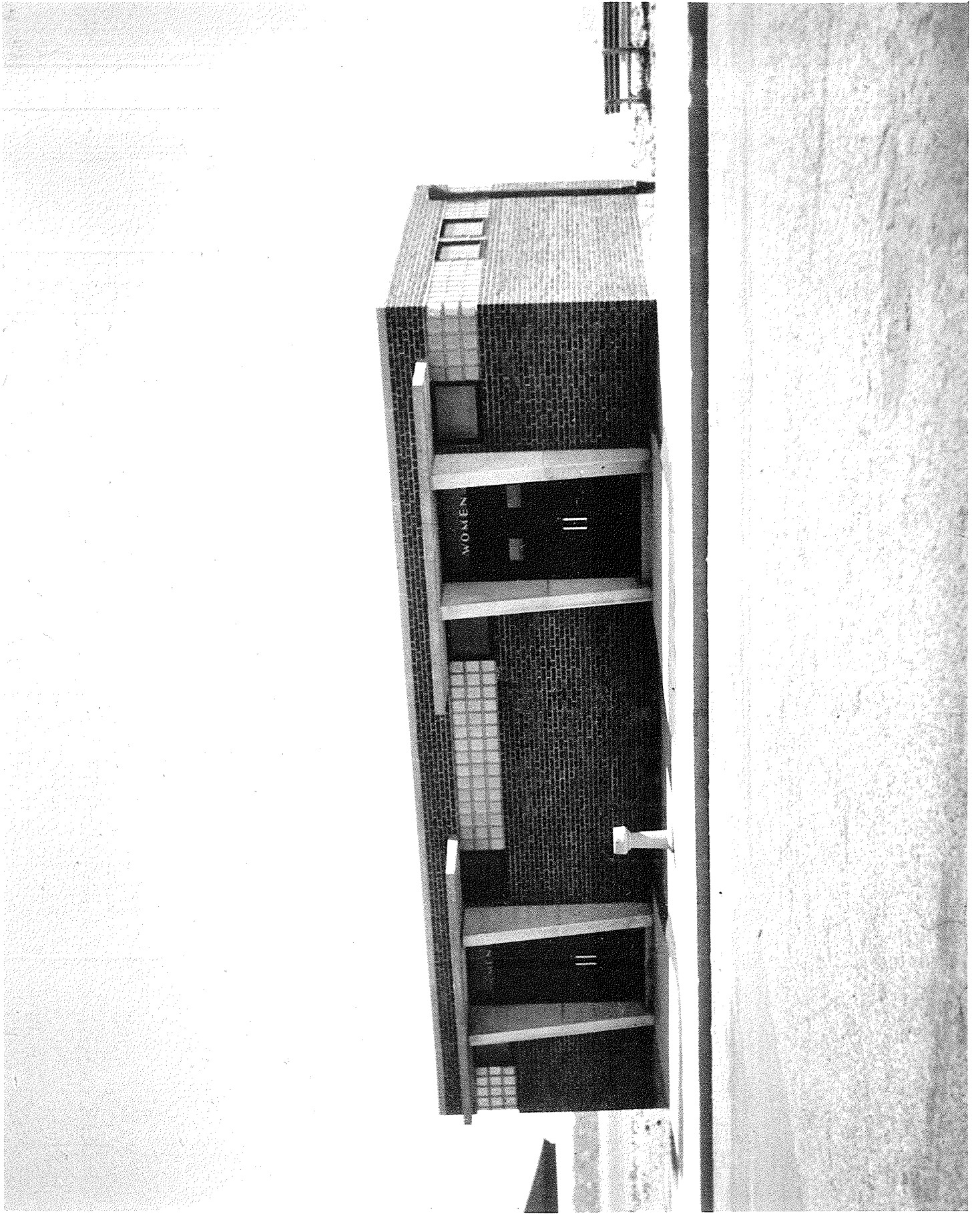




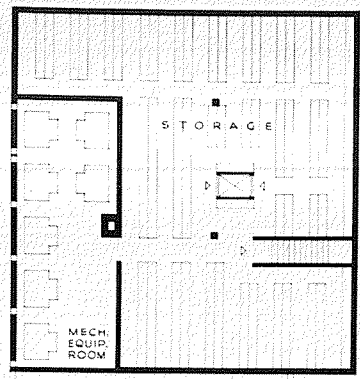




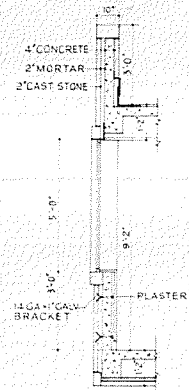




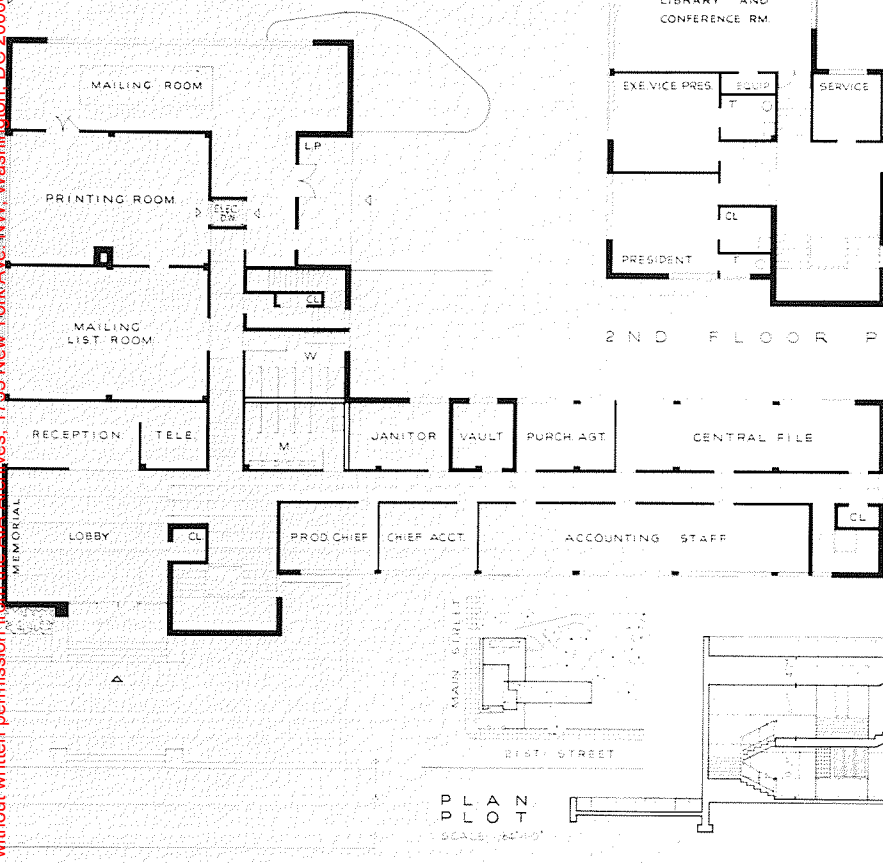
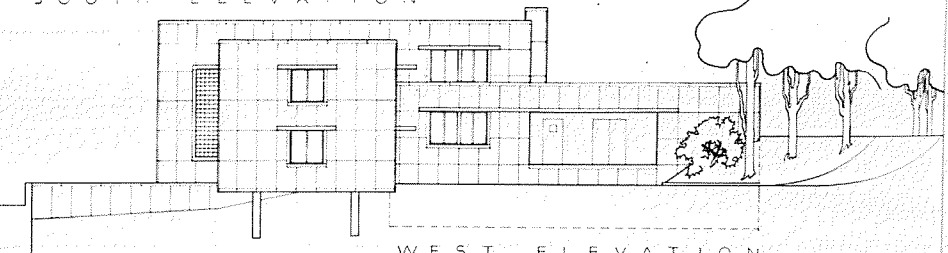
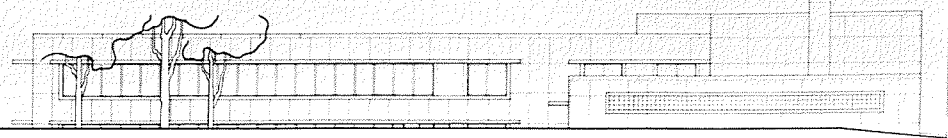
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BASEMENT PLAN



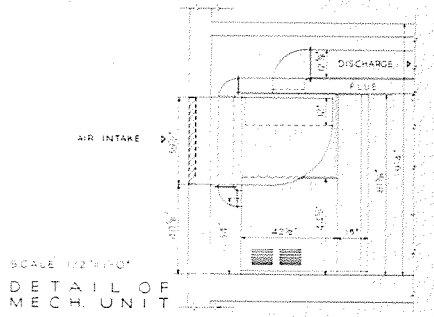
TYPICAL WALL DETAIL

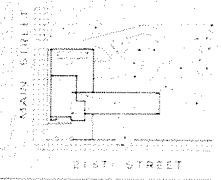
2ND FLOOR PLAN

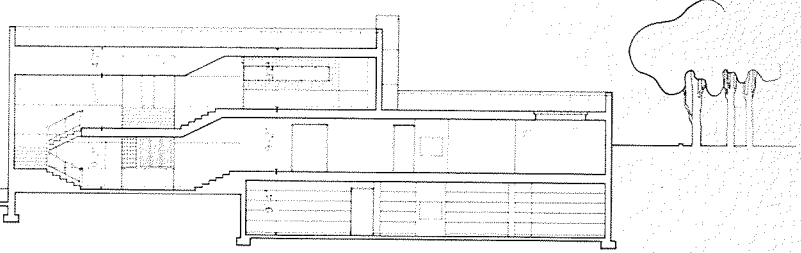

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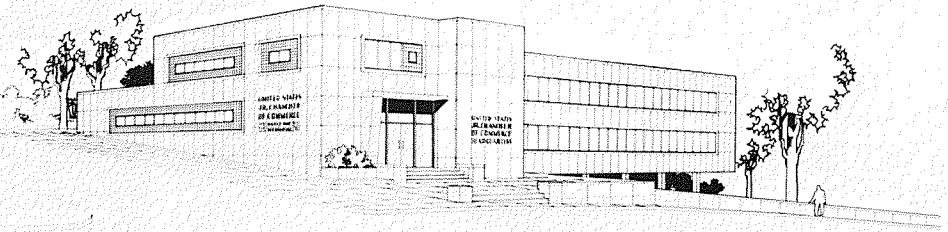
DETAIL OF MECH. UNIT



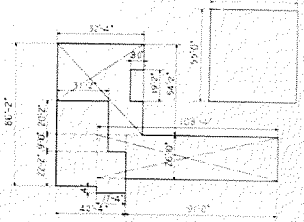

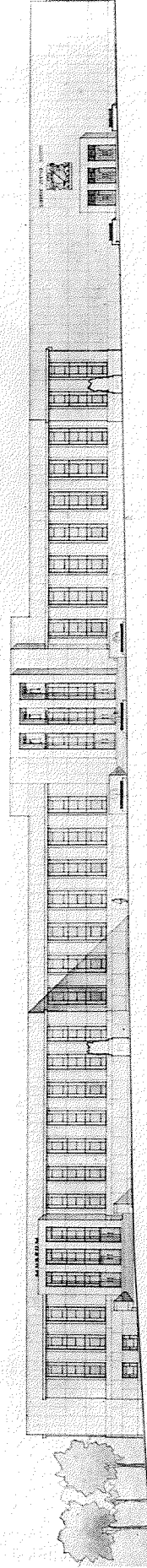
CROSS SECTION THRU CENTER OF BUILDING

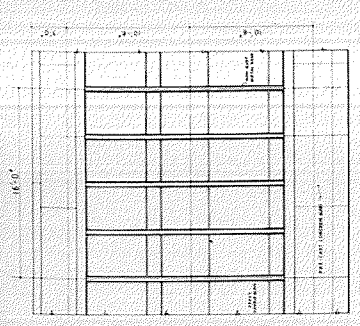
BASEMENT FLOOR PLAN



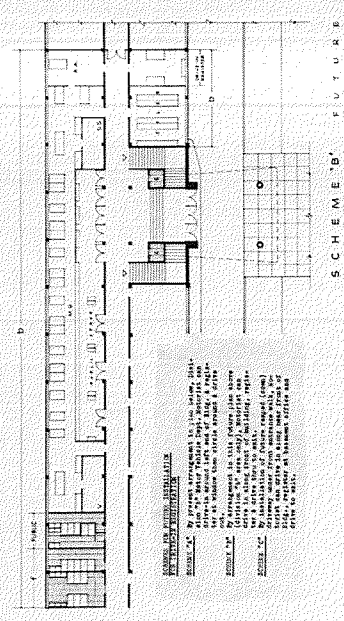

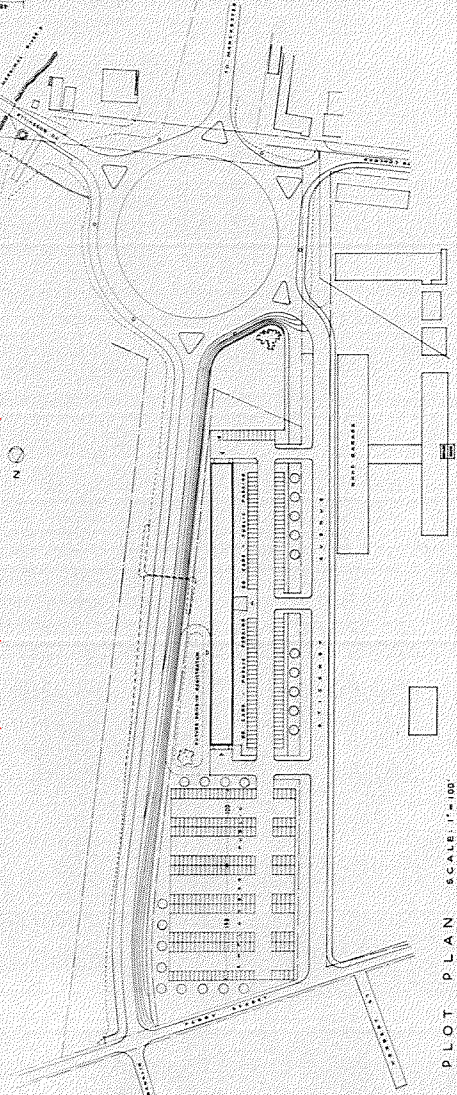
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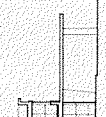
1/4" SCALE DETAIL OF TYPICAL BAY



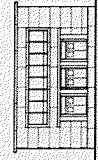

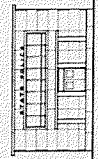

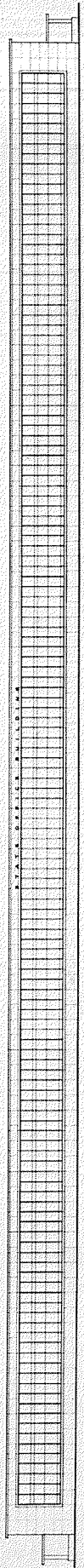
CROSS SECTION



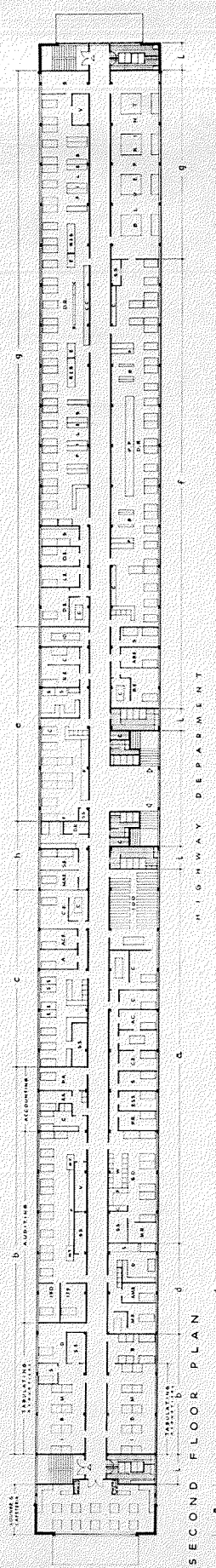
