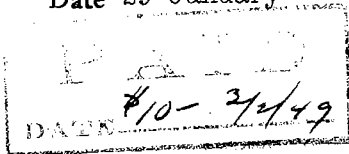


Dear Mr. Hughes:

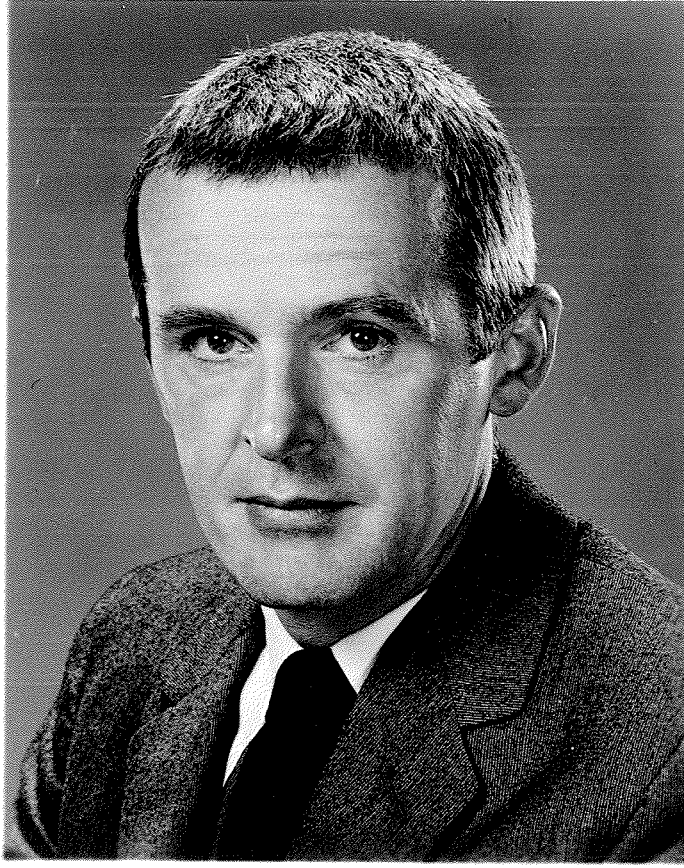


Gentlemen:
