# Architect of KEMH and extended care wing dies

The man who designed King Edward VII Memorial Hospital and its new acute care wing died last week.

Architect Mr. William James Taylor, a long-time resident of Bermuda, died January 22 of a thoracic aneurysm at Johns Hopkins University Hospital in Baltimore, Maryland. He was 79.

Mr. Taylor was a founding partner of Ferrenz & Taylor Architects (now Taylor, Clark Architects) of New York City.

Apart from the hospital's main

building, the firm was also responsible for the design of the Extended Care Unit which opened last year and the new courtyards at St. Brendan's Hospital.

Mr. Taylor specialised in the design of hospitals and other health care facilities. He also worked on the design for the rotunda at the National Gallery of Art and the restoration of Colonial Williamsburg.

"I found him to be a very gentle person," Government architect Mr. Arthur Seymour said yesterday. "He was well-liked in Bermuda. He did a

good service to the Island with his hospital programmes."

Mr. Taylor was born in Liverpool, England and moved to the United States to attend Syracuse University from which he graduated in 1936. For many years, he had a home in Puget.

He is survived by one son, two daughters, five grandchildren, a sister and two brothers.

A funeral service for Mr. Taylor is to be held at 2 p.m. this Friday at the Church of Transfiguration on East 29th Street, New York City.
