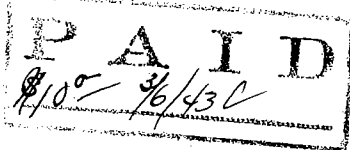


Dear Sir:

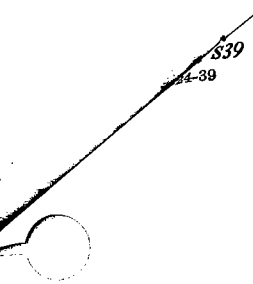

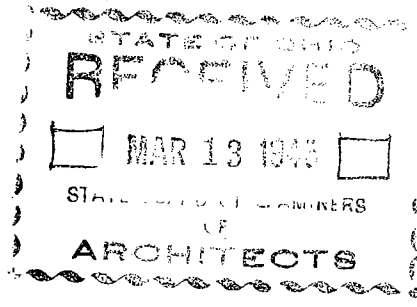
