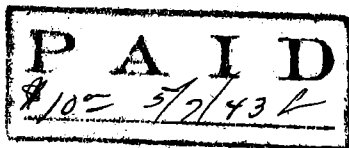

of Unprofessional Conduct

You are hereby advised that on May 13, 1967, the Board of Directors of the American Institute of Architects denied your request that the Board hear the charges made against you by the New York Chapter, AIA, for alleged unprofessional conduct.

The meeting of the Board of Directors ended on May 13, 1967. Therefore, pursuant to Chapter XIV, Article 2, Section 1b, of the Bylaws of the Institute, the decision of the National Judicial Board in your case became final on that date.

Pursuant to said decision you are hereby censured.

The Board of Directors has ruled that "results of actions taken by the National Judicial Board be published in the MEMO in the form prescribed by the Bylaws." Accordingly this will be done in connection with your case in an early issue of the MEMO.

Although a penalty of censure does not entail any losses of rights or privileges of corporate membership, it is a reprimand and is recorded as such.

GEORGE SOLE, 65, ARCHITECT, DEAD

Kennedy Airport Chapel

April 23, 1973

George J. Sole, an architect who was perhaps best known for his ecclesiastical buildings, died Friday of a heart ailment at the Booth Memorial Hospital in Flushing, Queens. He was 65 years old and lived at 347 East 52d Street.

Mr. Sole redesigned the Holy Family Roman Catholic Church at 315 East 47th Street, adding the Pope John XXIII multilingual library and a three-story rectory. The remodeled edifice was dedicated as the United Nations parish church in 1965.

He also designed the Roman Catholic Chapel of Our Lady of the Skies at Kennedy International Airport, which was dedicated in 1965.

Mr. Sole had been architect for more than 40 churches as well as several synagogues and a number of convents, rectories and parochial schools. He had also designed public elementary schools here, a police station-house for the 25th precinct in Harlem, apartment houses and residences.

He had been architect for condominiums here and abroad and most recently was architect for the Byram complex of Port Chester, N. Y.

He was a member of the New York Chapter of the American Institute of Architects.

Mr. Sole, who was born in Naples, Italy, was brought to the United States as an infant. He studied at New York University, Columbia University and the Beaux Arts Institute.

Surviving are his widow, Antoinette; a brother, Peter, and two sisters, Mrs. Leo Perry and Mrs. Albert Schisano.

A funeral mass will be held Tuesday at 11 A.M. at Holy Family Church.
