It is with genuine regret that I write, as Secretary of the Institute, to advise you of the termination of your membership in the Institute and your Chapter, effective December 31, 1931, for non-payment of Institute dues.

The Treasurer, and the Secretary's Office, sent to you various statements of account and letters in the hope that you would find it possible to make a remittance, in whole or in part, and thereby continue your affiliation with The American Institute of Architects and your Chapter.

It is realized that conditions in the building industry have remained on a most unfavorable basis during the past year, and for that reason the Institute made a special effort to retain your membership as long as possible.

It is believed that you will approve of the action taken. The alternative was to allow the dues to so increase as to make future reinstatement a heavy expense.

Dear Mr. Folts:

In reply to your letter of February, 4, concerning the status of Mr. George F. Shreiber:

According to The Institute records, Mr. Shreiber's membership was terminated on December 31, 1931, at which time he was indebted for Institute dues in the amount of \$58.33.

We are gratified to learn that Mr. Shreiber wishes to be reinstated and note that he is willing to pay \$25.00 of the defaulted dues, plus the current years dues. This would entail the remission of the balance of his dues in default (\$33.33), and such remission can be brought about only by action of The Board of Directors.

The proper procedure would be for Mr. Shreiber to address a letter to The Secretary, Mr. Charles T. Ingham, The Octagon, 1741 New York Avenue, Washington, D.C., requesting reinstatement, stating that he is professionally engaged in the practice of architecture, and asking for the remission of dues as set forth above.

Check covering the \$25.00 outstanding dues he proposes to pay, plus \$20.00 dues in advance and \$5.00 admission fee, a total of \$50.00, should accompany the letter.

The letter will come before The Board at its next meeting and we have every reason to believe that they will act favorably on the request for remission of dues.

It will be necessary, of course, for the Chapter to remit any dues that may be outstanding to the Chapter.

The Board will meet early in May so the request for reinstatement and remission of dues should reach this office well in advance of that time.

Dear Mr. Furst:

This will acknowledge receipt of your letter of April 20, forwarding four applications for membership in The Institute and the Chicago Chapter, together with checks for \$10.00 from each applicant and the Favorable Recommendation of the Chapter.

Among these was the application of Mr. George F. Schreiber. Mr. Schreiber is a former member of the Institute, his membership having terminated on December 31, 1931 for the non-payment of Institute dues. He owed dues for 1929, 1930, and 1931 in the total amount of \$58.34.

Under the by-laws a former member may not be reinstated while he is indebted to The Institute or any of its chapters. When such former members apply for readmission, they must pay for back dues unless such dues are remitted by action of The Board.

In unusual circumstances, and upon recommendation of the chapter, The Board often is agreeable to the remission of back dues, provided the chapter remits any dues for the chapter for a like period; and provided the former member applies for readmission.

Also, former members are not entitled to the reduced dues now in effect for new members, and their applications for readmission must be accompanied by payment of \$25.00 - \$5.00 for the admission fee and \$20.00 for the current year's dues - in advance.

We are not writing to Mr. Schreiber in this matter, as yet, as it appeared to be the better procedure to advise the chapter of the situation first and then hold the application pending advice of further instructions or recommendations from the chapter.

Dear Mr. Tislow:

Dear Mr. Schreiber:

On behalf of The Secretary, this will acknowledge receipt of your application for readmission to membership in The Institute and assignment to the Chicago Chapter, together with your check for \$10.00.

When your membership lapsed on December 31, 1931 you were indebted for Institute dues for the years 1929 to 1931, inclusive, in the total amount of \$58.34.

However, we have received the recommendation of the Indiana Chapter, to which you were assigned at that time, that your indebtedness for past Institute dues be remitted by The Board of Directors of The Institute; and advising that your outstanding chapter dues have been waived.

The chapter's recommendation will be submitted to The Board at its next meeting - probably some time in the late fall. We regret this delay, but only The Board has the power to remit dues payments.

In addition to the above, there remains one further item to complete your application; i.e., payment of \$15.00 additional for the first year's Institute dues in advance.
