(a) Charles R. Sutton graduated from Oklahoma A & M College (now Oklahoma State University) in 1950 and subsequently was employed in the firm of Parr & Aderhold in Oklahoma City. In 1953 he received a tuition grant from Cranbrook Academy of Art (Bloomfield Hills, Michigan) and received a Master of Architecture Degree there in 1954. In 1955 he was awarded the Lloyd Warren Fellowship (Paris Prize) after being named first alternate, for 18 months of travel in Europe and study at Both at Cranbrook and during the Fellowthe Ecole des Beaux Arts. ship his concern was study of the urban environment, community plan-In 1957 he moved to New York and worked for ning and housing. In 1962 he joined the firm of John Carl Warnecke & I.M. Pei & Assoc. Assoc., first in Washington, D.C., and then was assigned to Honolulu, Hawaii during the design development and construction of the Hawaii State Capitol. He was Director of the Honolulu office of J.C. Warnecke & Assoc. from 1964 to 1968, and in 1968 opened the office of Charles R. Sutton & Associates, Inc.

In the Pei firm he was involved in urban renewal projects in Washington, D.C. and Pittsburgh, and worked in design development for the East West Center in Honolulu. Work of the Warnecke Honolulu office, in addition to the State Capitol, included the Honolulu Civic Center Master Plan, University of Hawaii Long-Range Development Plan, and design consultation and planning for the Kaanapali Resort Develop-From 1968 he began work in Planned Unit Development, downtown renewal and land use consultation in the firm of Charles R. Sutton & The firm received design awards in 1971 for Wailani Assoc., Inc. Condominium, 1974 for downtown restoration and renovation of buildings in the Merchant Square district, and a citation for Innovative Land Use in the 1970-71 Sunset Magazine/AIA Western Home Awards. was winner of the 1972 Kalakaua Commercial area competition by the Current work includes a development plan for the Bishop Estate.
