This is simply an organization started as the brain child of a man who was rejected for local membership in the A.I.A. A careful reading of the literature he has sent out will furnish a good clue as to why he was not approved.

Incidentally, we have already received copies of letters from two or three of the men named in the most recent pamphlet, stating that they did not authorize the use of their names and that they are resigning effective immediately.

We have avoided mention of this matter in any of our publications in the belief that to call attention to it would be to give it a dignity and advertising which it does not deserve. We may have to change this policy if literature of this type continues to come to our members.
