Dear Mr. Vezzoli:

Upon receipt of your letter of August 26th I made a search of our files from the date of your election on February 14, 1945, and do not find any communication from you with regard to your membership, your dues, or your resignation which you mention as having been submitted over and over.

Perhaps your resignations were addressed to the Chapter but could not be acted upon because of your indebtedness for dues.

We find in the files a report from the Chapter in 1948 that you owed your chapter for dues for 1946 and 1947 - the same period for which our records indicate you owe Institute dues also.

I'm sorry that I cannot give you any other answer, but procedure with regard to suspension and termination of a corporate membership when dues are not paid are provisions of The Institute's By-Laws and which are binding upon us. Notices of the impending action and of the final action in terminating your memberships were mailed to you, so you should have been acquainted with the procedure in sufficient time to permit restoration of your good standing.

The resignation of a corporate member cannot be accepted unless all outstanding dues to the A.I.A. and the Chapter are paid in full.

We were pleased to learn from the results of our recent Current Work Survey Questionnaire that you are interested in affiliating yourself with the A.I.A. again.
