


As of January 1 of this year, it was necessary for The Secretary to inform you that, because of your default of dues at the close of the previous year, your membership in The Institute had been suspended.

We are pleased to learn from your letter of June 22nd that you are planning to apply for readmission to membership in The Institute and its Buffalo-Western New York Chapter.

From our records it appears that your membership was terminated on December 31, 1949 for the non-payment of Institute dues for the years 1948 and 1949 in the total amount of \$50.00.

Enclosed is an application form to be filled in and filed; however, it will not be necessary to again secure the signature of two corporate members endorsing your application, since you would be applying for readmission.

That application should be accompanied by check for:

Dear Mr. Cimini:

In response to your letter of February 11th, we send, herewith, a sample of the application form now in effect, from which you will note two principal requirements for membership are citizenship in the United States and registration to practise as an architect.

Our records indicate that your previous membership lapsed on December 31, 1949, at which time you owed for Institute dues for 1948 and 1949 in the total amount of \$50.00.

Should you file an application for readmission, it should be accompanied by check for those past dues, plus \$10.00 readmission fee, plus \$50.00 for one year's dues in advance. This last amount is provided that your income from the practise of architecture during the previous year was over \$5,000. If such income was below that figure, then current dues would be \$25.00.

This makes a total of \$110.00, or \$85.00 at time of application.

If there were any dues owing to the Buffalo-Western New York Chapter when your membership lapsed, those chapter dues should be taken care of also. At present the Secretary of the Buffalo-Western New York Chapter is Mr. Philip W. Swain, 70 Niagara Street, Buffalo 2, N.Y. He could advise you on this point.

It is noted from your letterhead that your firm are licensed real estate brokers. If you are a real estate broker, also, perhaps you should scrutinize the attached Standards of Professional Practise in order to be certain that your present occupations permit consideration of your application for membership as a practising architect. You might wish to discuss this with Mr. Swain, also.
