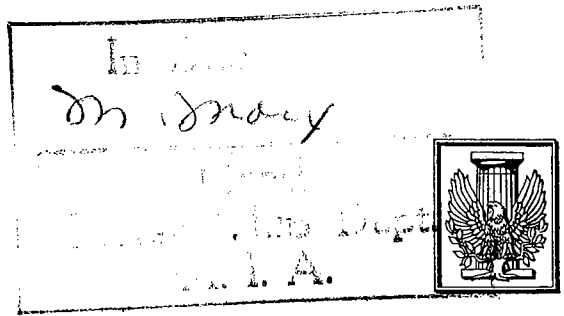

Dear Board:

This is to request MEMBER EMERITUS status effective immediately.

I have been a National A.I.A. member and a member of the San Diego Chapter, both in good standing so far as I know, continuously for 15 years (since Feb. 3, 1964).

Fate and government regulations permitting, I will commence my 66th year on April 11, 1979. Since Jan. 1, 1979, I have been attempting to retire from the active practice of architecture. By way of supporting this attempt I have done such things as apply for the commencement of Social Security benefits, ask for Keogh account disbursements, change my phone from business to residence, learn (with great difficulty) to say no, turn the office heat off on Friday afternoon so I can't work Saturday and Sunday, shovel snow, etc. I have mixed feelings of regret and relief but I am beginning to sense just the slightest indication the relief will eventually dilute regret.

In the event the Board grants this request, I presume that, in accordance with the by-laws, the Chapter Board will notify the Secretary of the Institute of its action. Such notification should then result in my being declared a MEMBER EMERITUS of the Institute.

I would like to apologize to my brother Chapter architects and associates for seemingly contributing so little to Chapter affairs. Two conditions are responsible for my failure. The first is the 120 mile round trip at night and the second is that I'm just not much of a social animal. I have, however, made what I hope are significant contributions to my community and San Diego County which will, if only indirectly, improve the image of the profession in the public estimation.
