

Lyle F. Zisler, A. I. A., Detroit architect, died suddenly in Pontiac General 95% Hospital on January 21, following a heart attack. He was 48 years of age.

Born in Detroit January 4, 1910, Mr. Zisler received his bachelor of science in architecture from the University of Michigan in 1932. He became registered as an architect in Michigan the same year, and subsequently in several other states.

After employment in Detroit architects' offices, he entered his own practice in 1936. During World War 11 he was engaged in aircraft and missile design with the Byrne Engineering Corporation. He rentered his own practice in 1946, with D. L. Briegel, engineer, as Zisler, Briegel and Associates, Architects and Engineers. At the time of his death, he practiced as Lyle F. Zisler & Associates, Architects, with offices at 514 McKerchey Building, Detroit.

He was a member of The Anerican Institute of Architects, its Detroit Chapter and the Michigan Society of Architects.
